

Monday, September 24, 1951.

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmon³⁸ on Monday, September 24, 1951 at 7:30 P. M.

Present: Reeve Beamish in the Chair, Councillors Armstrong, Charlton, Isherwood, MacSorley, Philips, Sargent, and Wilks.

1 A. Kucher wrote on behalf of the National Federation of Labor Youth of Burnaby requesting an interview with the Council with respect to the proposed granting of an easement in Confederation Park. Mr. Kucher appeared.

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That Mr. Kucher be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

2 Mr. Kucher spoke protesting the granting of the easement through Confederation Park suggesting that the Park should be retained for recreational purposes particularly in the interests of the youth of the community. Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Philips "That the communication be received."

Carried Unanimously.

3 E. Strachan wrote on behalf of a group of ratepayers of Capitol Hill requesting audience before the Council to express views concerning the proposed sale of land adjoining Confederation Park. A delegation appeared.

Moved by Councillor Philips and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That Mr. Perritt be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

4 Mr. Perritt spoke protesting the granting of the easement in Confederation Park and suggested that the proposed sale of lands adjoining Confederation Park should not be favourably considered as it was not deemed advisable to allow large industrial concerns in the Municipality. Moved by Councillor Philips and seconded by Councillor Armstrong "That the communication be received."

Carried Unanimously.

5 Mrs. Margaret H. Apps wrote representing a meeting of local residents in the North Burnaby area requesting an interview with the Council with regard to the proposed easement in Confederation Park. A delegation appeared.

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Wilks "That Miss V. Downton be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

Miss Downton spoke protesting the proposed granting of an easement in Confederation Park suggesting that the Company should be made to construct their pipe line on the north side of the C. P. R. right-of-way. Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Philips "That the communication be received."

Carried Unanimously.

6 The Returning Officer submitted return of votes cast for and against "Burnaby District Improvement By-law No. 3, 1951" at the By-law election held September 22, 1951, as follows:

Votes in favour	104
Votes against	5

Number of valid ballots	109
Three-fifths required	65

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Philips "That the report of the Returning Officer be received."

Carried Unanimously.

7 The Returning Officer submitted return of votes cast for and against "Burnaby District Improvement By-law No. 4, 1951," at the By-law election held September 22, 1951, as follows:

Three-fifths required	21

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Wilks "That the report of the Returning Officer be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Sargent "That "Burnaby District Improvement By-law No. 3, 1951," be now reconsidered."

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That

"Burnaby District Improvement By-law No. 3, 1951," be now finally adopted, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and the Corporate seal affixed thereto.

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That "Burnaby District Improvement By-law No. 4, 1951," be now reconsidered."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That "Burnaby District Improvement By-law No. 4, 1951," be now finally adopted, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and the Corporate seal affixed thereto."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Councillor Philips and seconded by Councillor Armstrong "That "Burnaby Soldiers' Taxes Extension By-law 1951" be now reconsidered."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Councillor Philips and seconded by Councillor Armstrong "That "Burnaby Soldiers' Taxes Extension By-law 1951" be now finally adopted, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and the Corporate seal be affixed thereto."

Carried Unanimously.
