COMMITTEE REPORT

Committee of the Whole

Your Committee met on Monday, November 26th, 1951, and recommended that where a water consumer pays a sum in advance covering the bi-annual or annual fee for domestic water supply, and subsequently has a water meter installed to supply the same property, he shall not be required to pay the meter rate until the expiration of the period for which the domestic water fee has been paid, provided that where a license or permit is granted for the operation of an establishment requiring the use of a water meter, between the time the domestic water fee is paid, and the expiration of the period covered by the said fee, this regulation shall not apply.

Moved by Councillor Armstrong and seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the report of the Committee of the Whole be adopted."

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That "Burnaby Land Sale By-law No. 14, 1951" be now reconsidered."

South Burnaby Ratepayers' Association wrote requesting an opportunity to interview the Council in connection with the proposed sale of Municipal lands to an oil company. A delegation appeared.

Moved by Councillor Armstrong and seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the delegation be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

Mrs. Turner spoke requesting that the by-law be submitted to the North Burnaby people only since the effect of the granting of the easement to Standard Oil Company over Confederation Park would directly concern those people in the North area.

The delegation was advised that it was legally impossible to submit such by-laws to portions of the Municipality and had to be submitted to the electorate as a whole.

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the communication be received."

Carried Unanimously.
