Engineer submitted report advising that Greater Vancouver Water Board had Been approached jointly by Burnaby, Coquitlam, and Port Moody to construct a supply main from Westburnco reservoir along North Road to the North Boundary of Port Moody. The toTal estimated cost of the work including necessary pump and storage facilities is \$292,000,00 which results in an annual charge of approximately \$21,000.00. There will be no charge against the Municipalities provided the value of water supplied annually equals or exceeds this amount. In the event that water consumption does not reach this point, the difference is to be made up jointly by the three Municipalities in proportion to their consumption in each year.
