In view of the foregoing, your Commission would re-affirm their original recommendation that the above-described property rezoned from

Residential to Gascline Service Station zone. Matter of rezoning of lots 10. 11 and 12. Subdivision "B". Block 4. listrict Lot 38.

The Commission re-affirmed its original recommendation of rezoning of these parcels to Local Commercial, pointing out that the closest Commercial zone was a distance of over half a mile away and that objections raised by the people in the area were not considered of sufficient logic to alter the opinion of the Commission.

Mr. McPhee, Barrister, spoke on behalf of the residents in the vicinity of Maywood, Imperial and Sussex, drawing attention to the stipulation as contained in the original sale whereby buildings would not be allowed to be erected within 20° from the eastern corner of the property, pointing out that this would prevent any traffic hazard from the construction of buildings on the property.
