## Tueslay, April 7, 1953.

A regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held at the Municipal Hall, Edmonds, on Tuesday, April 7, 1953, at 7:35 p.m.

Present: Reeve Beamish in the Chair, Councillors Armstrong, Charlton, Orummond, Isherwood, MacSorley, Philps and Wilks.

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Wilks "That the minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written, and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously.

New Vista Society wrote a letter of appreciation to the Council for co-operation in making available additional lands to their Society at a nominal sum for the extension of their Senior Citizens Housing Project. Moved by Councillor Philps and seconded by Councillor Isherwood "That the letter be received.

Carried Unanimously.

Chief Commercial Manager. B. C. Telephone Company wro to with reference to the survey of the telephone facilities within the Municipal Hall advising some preliminary work had been done in this connection approximately 18 months ago but the finalization of the survey had been held in abeyance as it was understood the Council was considering the reconstruction of a new Municipal Hall building. The Company advised they were now willing to recommence the survey and advise of the results. Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Philps "That the letter be received.

Carried Unanimously.

Eurnaby Parent-Teacher Council submitted a request for an interview with the Council in connection with the provision of a footpath on Marine Drive between Royal Oak Avenue and Boundary Road for school children.

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor MacSorley "That the letter be received and the Parent-Teacher Council be sivised of the water main installation work performed in this area and the resulting strip made available for a pedestrian pathway."

Carried Unanimously.

C. B. Riley Limited submitted an application on behalf of a client for rezoning of the East 149° of the Ed of Lot 2, Block 14, District Lot 70, Map 3284 to "Commercial" to allow the operation of a gasoline service station. "That the Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Charlton. That the application be received and referred to the Town Planning Commission for consideration and recommendation." Carried Unantmously.

C. B. Riley Limited wrote advising of plans of the B. C. Curling Rinks Limited to erect a 16 sheet curling rink complete with club and restaurant facilities, suggesting that the firm might consider as a good choice, property at the north-west corner of Centual Park provided a suitable lease could be arranged. Moved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Jrummond "That the letter be received and a committee be set up to consider the application of the C. B. Riley Company."

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Carried Unanimously. The committee appointed included Councillors Armstrong, Philps and )rummend.

Mrs. Mary A. Greenbank wrote protesting the decision of the Council in refusing her claim for the loss of poultry by stray dogs.

Moved by Councillor Philps and seconded by Councillor Charlton "That the letter be received and this matter be referred back to the Sheep Protection Act Committee for further consideration. Carried Unanimously.

North Slope Ratepayers' Association submitted copies of correspondence between their Association and the Greater Vancouver Water district in connection with claims for damages made by members of their organization as a result of blasting operations by the Greater Vancouver Water Jistrict in Burrard Inlet causing lamage to the homes of people in the North Slope area. The Association requested that the Engineer or Builling Inspector be instructed to examine some of the damage with a view to giving an expert opinion.

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Charlton "That the correspondence be received and that the Association be advised this Corporation can admit no liability and that the claims of the residents should be made directly to the Greater Vancouver Water Board."

Carried Unanimously.

South East Burnaby Ratepayers' Association wro to advising their Association had gone on record as being opposed to placing a charge on residents for storm irainage and that such charges should be taken from general revenue. The Association also requested information as to the installation of a "Caution" sign on 12th Avenue between First and Second Streets.

Moved by Cr. Armstrong and seconded by Councillor Jrummond "That the letter be received and the Association be informed of the Council's orinion that the

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responsibility for storm drainage is that of the benefitting ratepayers' and further that the installation of a traffic sign on 12th Avenue was in the hands of the Municipal Engineer."
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Carried Unanimously.

T. McW. Ford submitted an application for approval of Lot 48, Blocks 42 and 43, District Lot 152 and 153 as the site for erection of an apartment

block.

Moved by Councillor Jrummond and seconded by Councillor Wilks "That the application be received and referred to the special Apartment Committee for investigation and report." Carried Unanimously.

S. J. Kraus submitted an application for permission to convert the building at 3814 Oxford Street into an apartment.

Moved by Councillor Jrummond and seconded by Councillor Wilks "That the application be received and referred to the special Apartment Committee." Carried Unanimously.

Pythian Cerebral Palsy Committee submitted an application for permission to hold a tag day in the Municipality on June 13th.

J. E. and R. M. Johnson submitted advice that they were willing to convey a portion of their land for the purpose of constructing a "turn around" at the dead end of Clinton Street for the sum of \$325.00 contingent upon the sale resulting in a revision of the assessment covering their lot as the result of its reduction by 3,250 square feet.

The Building Inspector submitted a report on the communication by the B. C. Underwriters' Association advising that subsequent to receipt of their recommendations in 1949 the proposed Fire Limited By-law was drafted and was held in abeyance as it was considered such by-laws should fit in with the proposed revision of the National Building Code. The Building Inspector advised that as the revision of the Code had not proceeded as rapidly as anticipated, he was proceeding with the finalization of a Fire Limite By-law for the Municipality rather than await publication of the revised National Building Code.

Moved by Councillor Isherwood and seconded by Councillor Wilks "That the correspondence be received and the B. C. Underwriters' Association be advised of action being taken."

Building Inspector submitted a copy of a notice issued by the Inspector of Electrical Energy to all Electrical Contractors commencing a new scale of fees for electrical permits and inspections. The Building Inspector pointed out that "Burnaby Electrical Inspection By-law 1928" had been amended by By-law No. 3196 to adopt Sections 3, 4 and 6 of the Electrical Energy Inspection Act which had the effect of adoption the scale of fees in the said Act. The Building Inspector gave notice that it was the understanding that the electrical permit fees would change on May 1st, 1953 in accordance with the new rate schedule as effected through an amendment to the Electrical Energy Inspection Act.

Engineer submitted a report giving a schedule of Local Improvement pavements completed in the year 1953 detailing total costs, the cost per assessed foot to be borne by the Corporation to reduce the cost to the property owners to 80 cents per front foot and the total amount in dollar which the Corporation would bear if these reductions were made. The Engineer further reported that if it was the intention of the Council to reduce the costs as shown, it would be necessary to pass separate By-laws under Section 61 of the Local Improvement Act for each pavement project. The total cost to the Corporation should such By-laws be passed would amount to \$2,822.50.

Woved by Councillor MacSorley and seconded by Councillor Jrummond "That the report of the Engineer be adopted and the necessary By-laws reducing the rate to 80 cents and authorizing the Corroration to pear the difference in cost be brought down.
