The Social Service Administrator submitted a report of his lepartment showing direct costs up to December 1st 1954 for Social allowances paid to Boarding and nursing homes as rearrhangements compared to the estimates for the year.

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted a report on the request of the Capitol Hill Ratepayers' Association to supply connections to the Capitol Hill School into the proposed Willingdon Avenue and Capitol Hills er system. The Engineer reported that the connection would involve the installation of a pumping station capable of pumping 300 gallons per minute, and that the cost involved included 670 feet of pressure sever at \$7075.00. The Engineer recommended that the installation be not entertained since the cost was out of proportion for the cenefit to be derived and the installation of a pumping station would require constant maintenance. Furthermore, the school could be serviced by a gravity system as and when the central portion of Capitol Hill became served with said sewer. Moved by cr. Morrison, seconded by cr. Wilks that the report be received and a copy be forwarded to the Capitol Hill Ratepayers' Association.

Carried Unanimously.

The Apartment Committee submitted a report on the application of Boyl, Plannery and Haddy Realty Limited for approval of Lot 9, S.J. "A" Blk. 45 0.L.151/3, Map 1598 as an apartment site, recommending that the application be approved subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The ground floor of the proposed outling is not lawer than the elevation of the sidewalk on low Avenue fronting the property.
- (2) The height of the proposed ouilding does not exceed two storeys.
- (3) The proposed ouilding is erected in conformity with all Apartment Regulations.
- (4) The approval of this apartment site will lapse unless construction of the proposed building is commenced within 130 days or date of Council's approval thereof."

Moved by cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. W.P.Philps "That the recommendation of the Committee oe adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Apartment Committee submitted a report on the application of Boyd, Flannery and Haddy Pealty Limited for approval of Lot 10, block 8, ).L.56 as an apartment site, recommending that the application be turned down on the grounds that the eres surrounding the proposed apartment site was built up with substantial medium priced single family homes and therefore its not lend itself to the location of multiple family dwellings. Furthermore, the property was located on a side hill thus limiting the facilities available for septac tank sewage lis-Moved by cr. charlton, seconded by cr. Wilks "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted." Carried Unanimously.

The Planning Engineer submitted a report on the application of Rivers Realty Limited to erect a swelling on Lot "C" of Lot 8, lock 9, ).L.173 recommending that the application be denied on the grounis that the soil and drainage conditions in the area in question situated in a Heavy Industrial district sere such that residential development at a density as great as proposed quite pre-Expixed cipitate a rotential menace to Public Health.
