It was also pointed out that the everhead type was infessible and that it had therefore been

decided a level crossing was the most suitable. It was reinted out that the hazard would be minimazed through the installation of protective gates at the orossing. Mr. Blake received the information and suggested he might be given an orpertunity at a later date and further discuss the matter with the Council after additional study of the project by his Board.
