

Friday, August 24, 1956.

A regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, 4000 Grandview Highway, on Friday, August 24, 1956 at 7.30 p.m.

Present: Acting Reeve W.P. Philips in the Chair; Councillors Hean, Hughes, Morrison, Drummond, Charlton.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously.

The Special Committee appointed in connection with the application of Swedish Canadian Rest Home for permission to establish a Rest Home situated in a Small Holdings zone submitted an opinion that the existing Town Planning By-law did not permit the development of such an enterprise within a Small Holdings district. The Committee reported there appeared little doubt as to the compatibility of the proposed development with the surrounding development. Furthermore it was considered that in general this type of development could well be permitted in most residential areas provided adequate site areas and standards were required and certain other conditions were met. The Committee suggested that the applicants be directed to the Town Planning Board of Appeal for consideration by that Board to the approval of the location of the subject enterprise in the area in question.

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the report be received and approved and that a representative of the Administration appear before the Board sitting in connection with this application and argue in favour of a relaxation of the Town Planning By-law."

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Hean withdrew from the meeting.

Hean, Wylde and Hyde submitted an application for rezoning Lot 8, of Lot 2, Blk. 3, J.L. 162 Plan 15550 for Two Family Use.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the application be tabled pending a report from the Town Planning Commission and Planning Engineer."

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Hean returned to the meeting.

Uptown Investments Limited submitted an application for rezoning Lots 15 and 16, Block 28, J.L. 117E<sub>2</sub> for industrial purposes.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the application be referred to the Town Planning Commission and Planning Engineer for report."

Carried Unanimously.

F. A. Buckley wrote further with reference to his application for rezoning Lots 1, 2 and 4, Block 85, J.L. 122/7 giving further details about his proposed apartment development on Lot 4 and requesting permission to operate a nursery stock business on Lots 1 and 2, on a temporary basis pending an additional apartment development on these lots.

Moved by Councillor Charlton, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the application for rezoning Lot 4 for Multiple Family purposes be approved for further consideration."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Hean "That it be suggested to the applicant F. A. Buckley that an application be made to the Town Planning Board of Appeal for approval of Lots 1 and 2, Block 85, J.L. 122/7 for the operation of a nursery stock business."

Carried Unanimously.

Messrs. Edwards and Edwards, Barristers and Solicitors, wrote with reference to the application of C. Troseth for rezoning Lot 6, Block 68, District Lot 33 for gasoline service station purposes, submitting that the lengthy delays to which their client had been subjected, was causing hardship and requesting action be taken by the Council to have the property rezoned for gasoline service station purposes.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the application be approved for further consideration."

Carried Unanimously.

The Burnaby School Board wrote with reference to discussions held with officials of the Corporation with regard to the acquisition of a school site to serve the area east of Douglas Road between Edmonds and Sperling Avenue, advising that a suitable site had been located in the vicinity of Mayfield Street which was available from a private owner interested presently in developing the property for residential purposes. The Board submitted that the owner would be favourably disposed to exchange the said property for other property in the vicinity of 10th Avenue and Newcombe Street and that professional appraisers on both parcels indicated that such an exchange could be practical. The Board also submitted details for reimbursing the Corporation for the fair market value of the Mayfield Street site as soon as it was required for school building purposes within a period of not less than two years.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the letter be received and referred to the Chief Administrative Officer and Planning Engineer for report."

Carried Unanimously.

Vancouver Heights Branch, Canadian Bank of Commerce, submitted an invitation to the Reeve and members of the Council to attend an Open House at their new premises, Hastings Street and Gilmore Avenue.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the invitation be received and accepted by all those able to attend."

Carried Unanimously.

L. F. Owens wrote submitting a complaint regarding a drainage problem in the lane between Frederick and Gray Avenues.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the letter be received and referred to the Engineer for report."

Carried Unanimously.

Provincial Civil Defence Co-ordinator submitted advice of an Orientation Course preceding the U.B.C.M. Convention on October 2nd at Penticton, B.C.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the notice be received and advice of Councillors wishing to attend be in the hands of the Municipal Clerk by September 5th."

Carried Unanimously.

Executive Director, U. B. C.M. submitted a progress report on arrangements made for the U.B.C.M. Convention in Penticton - October 3rd to 5th.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the letter be received."

Carried Unanimously.

B. C. Aviation Council submitted advice of the 1956 Annual conference on September 28 and 29th, extending an invitation for the Council to be represented.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Hean "That Councillor Charlton be delegated to attend."

Carried Unanimously.

E. A. Fountain, Civil Defence Co-ordinator, requested authority to attend a Staff Course in Civil Defence at Civil Defence College, Arnprior, from September 9th to 15th, all expenses to be paid by the Federal Government. The Co-ordinator also advised of an invitation from the London Life Insurance Company to spend one day at their Head Office for the purpose of discussing their Pension Plan, requesting authority to accept this invitation.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That authority be granted the Civil Defence Co-ordinator to attend the Civil Defence College and accept the London Life Insurance Company invitation, as requested."

Carried Unanimously.

Mrs. Henry Mervin submitted a complaint about the condition of the road in the 6200 Block Aubrey Street, adjoining the road fronting her property in the 6300 Block Aubrey Street, requesting that the Council undertake to properly construct this road and treat the surface with a dust layer.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the letter be received and referred to the Engineer for report."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Solicitor submitted advice of service of a Notice that the Atlas Copco Canada Ltd would apply in Supreme Court, Wednesday, September 5th for approval of a subdivision plan of property owned by it described Block 8, Lots 44 and 78, Group 1, N.W.). Plan 3049 which subdivision plan in question had been rejected by the Corporation Approving Officer on August 2, 1956 on the grounds that the Municipality would require a dedication of a 60' wide road allowance along the southerly portion of the property abutting the Great Northern Railway right-of-way. The Solicitor further reported the Notice suggested that no good reason existed for rejecting the plan and that it was unreasonable and unfair to demand land designated for future Highway construction by way of dedication without compensation therefor. The Solicitor requested Council's instructions in the matter.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the Solicitor be instructed to appear and protect the Corporation's interest in this matter."

Carried,  
Cr. Drummond against.

The Chief Building Inspector submitted a report of the activities of his Department for the month of July - July 16th to August 10th, 1956.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Chief Licence Inspector submitted a report on Sheep Protection Act claim of Mrs. A. South for the loss of 26 chickens valued at \$1.25 each making a total of \$32.50, recommending that as the poultry were reasonably well protected, the claim be settled by payment of \$25.00.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the recommendation of the Chief Licence Inspector be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

Chief Sanitary Inspector submitted a report on an application of Mr. Frank W. Smith for permission to operate an Experimental Chicken Farm on Lot 2, Block 11, J.L.131, Plan 6912 - 2091 Sperling Avenue, for the keep of from eight hundred to one thousand broiler chickens. The Inspector recommended that in view of the close proximity of neighboring homes the applicant be restricted to 500 poultry.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the recommendation of the Chief Licence Inspector be adopted.

Carried Unanimously.

A Special Committee reported having studied the request of the Burnaby Taxi Association for an increase in taxi fares recommending that a new schedule of rates as follows be introduced and the Cab and Commercial Vehicle By-law 1950 be amended accordingly:

Point to Point on Meter: For the first 1/3 of mile or 1 1/2 minutes	\$ .50
For each additional 1/3 mile or 1 1/2 minutes (whichever is greater)	.10

Time or Mileage: For the first 1 hour or fraction thereof	4.00
Or per mile (whichever is greater)	.45
For each subsequent 1/4 of an hour or fraction thereof (or per mile) whichever is greater	1.00 .45

Additional Passengers:

No charge shall be made for additional passengers.

Dismissal Fee: When a vehicle is called and upon arrival is not required; a dismissal fee of seventy cents shall be charged.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Parks Board submitted a Detailed Account of Works for the two week period ending August 5th, and the two week period ending July 22nd, 1956.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the report be received."

Cr. Morrison withdrew from the meeting.

Carried Unanimously.

The Parks Board submitted a report recommending that in order to provide adequate sports field accommodation in Prenter Park, the northerly portion of the site should be extended eastward for approximately seventy-five yards and consideration of the possibility of adding Lots 4, 7 and the west halves of Lots 5 and 6 of Block 1, J.L.160, was requested by the Council.

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the Parks Board be advised that the Council previously committed themselves to the sale of this property for industrial purposes, and cannot accede to the request of the Parks Board."

Carried, Cr. Hughes against.

The Treasurer submitted Disbursements for the two week period ended August 24th, 1956 in the total amount of \$476,758.06.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the Disbursements be approved as submitted."

Carried Unanimously.

Cr. Morrison returned to the meeting.

The Municipal Engineer submitted a report on investigations made of a bus route extension in the Central Park Garden Village area recommending that approval be granted to the route and bus stops as shown on the plan with the exception of the far side stop southward on McKay south of Kingsway. The Engineer submitted that this stop was restricted by a utility pole and it was suggested that the stop be moved further south to clear the restricted area.

Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the recommendations of the Engineer be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted a report on an application of the B.C. Electric Company for approval of installation of a 6" High Pressure gas main along the west side of the North Road from approximately 1500' south of the Leughed Highway to Clarke Road, recommending that approval be granted subject to the following conditions:

- (1) That this Corporation be fully protected against damages to public or private property arising out of the construction and operation of the gas main.
- (2) That the Company be responsible for the location of the gas main with respect to other services and utilities now in existence, and that any alteration or repair to Municipal services be their responsibility.
- (3) All streets are to be returned to their original condition to the satisfaction of the Municipal Engineer.

- (4) That the gas main be laid with a minimum cover of four feet and that the depth of cover be increased in specified locations where future grade alterations in the street may be foreseen.
- (5) If it should become necessary in the future to alter the grade of any existing street or unimproved right-of-way, the cost of altering the grade of the gas main or otherwise protecting the pipe against external loads, shall be borne by the Company.
- (6) Selected backfilling materials shall be used at street intersections and at other locations at the discretion of the Municipal Engineer.
- (7) The Company shall furnish at the completion of the job, complete "as constructed" plans and profiles in duplicate.
- (8) That a formal agreement be drawn up by the Municipal Solicitor between the Corporation and the B.C. Electric Company.

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the recommendation of the Engineer be approved with the exception of items five and 8 and that the Solicitor be instructed to approach the B.C. Electric Company with respect to the re-negotiation of the existing agreement entered into between the Company and the Corporation in 1926 concerning the laying of gas mains in the Municipality. Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted Cost report covering the paving of the following streets under the Local Improvement Act:

- (a) Helmes St. from Caribee Road to 10th Avenue.
- (b) Sumas Street from Haldem Avenue to Kensington Avenue.
- (c) Parkerest Drive from Kensington to Fell Avenue.

Moved by Cr. Merrison, seconded by Cr. Hean "That the reports be received and the necessary construction by-law be brought down." Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted a report covering the addition expenditures necessary for preparing road grades for the above streets. Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Merrison "That the report be received." Carried Unanimously.

The Engineer submitted Detailed Account of Works covering the two week period ending August 19th, 1956. Moved by Cr. Merrison, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the report be received." Carried Unanimously.

The Engineer submitted Board of Works Estimates for the two week period, September 3rd to 16th, 1956 in the total amount of \$53,450.00. Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Merrison "That the estimates as submitted be approved." Carried Unanimously.

The Engineer submitted Water Works Estimates of Work for the two week period, September 3rd to 16th, 1956 in the total amount of \$21,155.00. Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Merrison "That the estimates as submitted be approved." Carried Unanimously.

The Engineer submitted Garbage Collection Estimates for the two week period, September 3rd to 16th, 1956 in the total amount of \$7,275.00. Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Merrison "That the estimates as submitted be approved." Carried Unanimously.

The Engineer submitted Works Progress Report for the month of July, 1956. Moved by Cr. Charlton, seconded by Cr. Merrison "That the report be received." Carried Unanimously.

The Planning Engineer submitted a report on the feasibility of the Planning Department undertaking a comprehensive planning study of the North East Burnaby area. It was pointed out that planning of the area would have to be integrated with planning of the entire Municipality and that due to the topography features of the area, critical limitations on the communication and land used pattern of nearly one-third of Burnaby. For this reason it was considered planning of the area should not be delegated to an external agency. It was further pointed out that a planning study of this scope would require a considerable amount of time and that some staff difficulties would be encountered. However, in discussing staff matters with the Chief Administrative Officer and Personnel Director, it had been considered that an additional member should be added to the Department and that with such new member, the Department could

operate its day to day work and at the same time undertake this planning project. The Planning Engineer submitted an estimated cost of the project totalling \$12,000.00 (Twelve thousand dollars).

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the report be received and referred to a Committee of the Whole."

Carried,  
Cr. Hughes against.

The Planning Engineer submitted a report on an application of Forest Lawn Cemetery Company for an extension of the cemetery operation in District Lot 73-Block 3 and Block 5 S $\frac{1}{2}$  D.L.74. It was pointed out that the existence of cemeteries, which operations occupy large parcels of land, tend to disrupt the communication system in a particular area. However, since the area to the west is owned by the Provincial Government for institutional purposes and the land to the north was zoned for industrial purposes, and in view of the type and standard of development practice by the applicants, it was quite possible that a considerable portion of the subject parcels might be utilized for burial purposes without prejudicing adjoining property uses and values. The report stated that an east-west road connection should be obtained approximately along the present north boundary of the cemetery but because of the topography of the area, an uncertain road pattern to be developed in D.L.71 and 72, it was not possible to designate the location of such a road at this time. While the applicants appreciated the problems involved immediate concern was expressed over the essentiality of their obtaining the use for cemetery purposes of the extreme south-east and south-west corners of Block 3 D.L.73 and Block 5, D.L.74 since burial contracts had been entered into with various parties in these portions. The Planning Engineer recommended that approval be granted to the Company for the use of the above noted area pointing out that granting of such permission would not hinder the location of the road connection and that a further study could be given and a further report presented when pertinent circumstances were fully known.

Moved by Cr. Hean, seconded by Cr. Drummond "That the report be tabled pending receipt of a report from the Engineer on the extension of the Grandview Highway along Spratt Street and into the proposed cemetery area."

Carried Unanimously.

The Staff Land Sale Committee submitted a report on the following applications:

- (1) Application of C.B. Riley Industrial Corporation to purchase Lots 1 to 8, Blk. 13 D.L.70 and Lots 2, 3, and 4, blk. 49 D.L.69 for industrial use. The Sanitary Inspector reports property should be held until sewer situation is clarified. Planning Engineer requests the land be held until ultimate subdivision studied. Your Committee recommends concurrence in the report of the Sanitary Inspector and Planning Engineer."

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

- (2) Application of Shell Oil Co. of Canada Limited to purchase N.E. 39 acre portion of D.L.137 for oil products storage. It is recommended that this application be not entertained until proper development study of the area can be advanced, including the road system and land use pattern in the area.

Moved by Cr. Hughes, seconded by Cr. Morrison "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

Moved by Cr. Drummond, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the application be turned over to the North East Burnaby Committee for consideration in conjunction with other studies."

Recommended that this application be tabled until applicant supplies comprehensive information regarding intended development.

The Municipal Clerk reported to the Council that through an error these lots had been omitted from the most recent amendment to the Town Planning By-law and that provision was being made in the next Town Planning By-law for rezoning of these properties for commercial purposes.

Moved by Cr. Morrison, seconded by Cr. Charlton "That the applicant be advised of the situation with regard to the zoning of these properties."

Carried Unanimously.

(4) Application of Stephen Markley and Mena Ishbell Markley to purchase Lot 8, blk.14, J.L.117W<sub>2</sub> for industrial use. It was recommended that this property be sold at a price of \$1,800.00 subject to consolidation with Lots 9 and 10, Blk.14, J.L.117W<sub>2</sub>.

Moved by Cr.Hean, seconded by Cr.Merrison "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted." Carried Unanimously.
