

OCTOBER 15, 1957

A Public Hearing was held on Tuesday, October 15, 1957 at 7.15 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 4000 Grandview Highway, to consider applications for rezoning.

PRESENT: Reeve MacSorley in the Chair; Councillors W.P.Philps, Brown, Cafferky, F.Philps, Morrison, Hean and Hughes.

The following applications for rezoning were considered:

From Residential Two Family to Residential Multiple Family Type I.

Lots 13 and 14 E.1/3, Block 10, D.L.'s 116/186, Plan 1236.

(situated on the north side of Pender St. approximately 100' west of Ingleton Avenue)

No one appeared in opposition to this proposed rezoning.

From Residential Two Family to Gasoline Service Station:

Lots 1 and 2, Block 7A, D.L.155A, Plan 1425, save and except the southerly 20 feet thereof.

(situated at the south east corner of Stride Avenue and Marine Drive)

No one appeared in opposition to this proposed rezoning.

From Residential Multiple Family Type I to Gasoline Service Station:

Lot "B" except Explanatory Plan 8898, S.D.1, Block 31, D.L.152, Plan 5641.

(situated at the north-west corner of Imperial Street and Royal Oak Avenue).

Mr. F. H. Bonnell, appeared on behalf of the applicant and reviewed the situation with respect to the change in zoning which took place in 1955 and added that the Company had removed the dwelling from the subject property in contemplation of establishing a gas station thereon.

From Heavy Industrial to Residential Multiple Family Type III:

Lot 18, Block 10, D.L.173, Plan 1034.

(Situated on the north side of Trapp Road, approximately 186 feet east of Willard Avenue).

The applicant appeared and advised of his intention to convert the existing premises to multiple family occupancy.

The Hearing then adjourned.

A regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, following the Public Hearing at 7.30 p.m.

PRESENT: Reeve MacSorley in the Chair; Councillors W.P.Philps, Brown, Cafferky, Hean, Hughes, F.Philps and Morrison.

Rev. R. Hunter led in an Opening Prayer.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hughes "That the minutes of the previous meeting be adopted as written and confirmed."

Carried Unanimously.

Mr. T. E. Ellis, of Buell, Ellis, Sargent and Russell submitted a letter in connection with the operation of Mainland Clay Products Limited plant in D.L.215 advising that his clients were dismayed at the comments made by the Municipal Engineer in a recent report to Council dealing with the location of the plant in question, and requesting that he be granted the opportunity of addressing Council to clarify and elucidate on the statements made by the Engineer with a view to arriving at a practical solution to the problem at hand.

Moved by Councillor Hughes, seconded by Councillor Hean "That Mr. Ellis be heard."
Carried Unanimously.

Mr. Ellis objected to the statement made in the Engineer's report that material was being removed from the subject site without the knowledge of Corporation officials inasmuch as the entire programme was predicated on a plan prepared under the guidance of the former Municipal Engineer, and to ensure adherence to this plan,

the soil removal contractor was given explicit instructions as to the procedure to be followed in respect of the removal operation, and added that the construction of Barnet Road interfered somewhat with these methods of operations, although not to the extent where any great deviation was made from the plan in effect. Mr. Ellis further stated that the encroachment of the building on Municipally owned property was not the reason for the Company making application to lease this additional land and suggested that the entire matter be referred to a Special Committee to discuss with the principals in order to determine whether a more satisfactory or equitable solution can be found.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That a Committee be appointed to meet with the Engineering Department, Mr. Ellis and his clients to further discuss the matter."

Carried Unanimously.

His Worship, the Reeve appointed the Board of Works Committee, Chief Administrative Officer and himself as the Special Committee.

Clinton Street P.T.A. wrote requesting the a delegation from the Clinton-Glenwood P.T.A. be afforded the opportunity of addressing Council in regard to the dedication of the land lying immediately south of Prenter Park for park purposes.

Moved by Councillor Cafferky, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That the delegation be heard."

Carried Unanimously.

A representative from the Association appeared and advised that the people in this neighbourhood desired to enlarge the park facilities in order to accommodate the increasing child population in the immediate district and also to prevent industrial encroachment on the present park land. The representative added that the property in question presents a natural setting for park use and would, if dedicated, provide a barrier or buffer against industrial development.

Moved by Councillor Cafferky, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That this matter be referred to the Park Board for their attention."

Carried Unanimously.

Mr. M. Godfrey wrote in connection with the forthcoming Dominion/Provincial conference on taxation problems, suggesting that the Municipalities send strong representation to the Conference in an effort to obtain some measure of relief from the Senior Governments on the taxation burden being borne by Municipalities.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Hughes "That the letter be received and the writer advised of the procedure to be followed for the last conference of this kind and the steps which have been taken in preparation for this most recent conference."

Carried Unanimously.

Burnaby Ratepayers' Council submitted a letter relative to the forthcoming Federal/Provincial examination into taxation problems urging that the Council prepare a Brief describing the plight of the Municipalities in this respect and to submit the Brief to the Federal Government at this Conference.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the Ratepayers' Council be advised of the action taken by this Council in regard to the matter by the preparation of a Brief on school costs as they relate to taxes and the intention of the U.B.C.M. to distribute copies of this Brief to those in attendance at the Conference."

Carried Unanimously.

Burnaby Ratepayers' Council submitted a letter relative to traffic congestion on Burnaby Highways inquiring as to whether plans have been prepared by the Municipality for the relief of the situation and in particular with reference to access to Kingsway from Willingdon Avenue, Grandview Highway from Willingdon Avenue, Kingsway from Smith Avenue, Grandview Highway from Smith Avenue, Grandview Highway from Sperling Avenue and Lougheed Highway from Sperling Avenue.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That this matter be referred to the Traffic and Traffic Safety Committee for consideration and report."

Carried Unanimously.

Alfred Bingham wrote in regard to the Smith Avenue bus route advising that the present "stop" locations necessitates people having to walk up a hill to the Burnaby General Hospital and requesting that overtures be made to the B.C. Electric Company to determine if the bus could be re-routed to bring visitors nearer to the Hospital.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Brown "That this matter be referred to the Public Utilities Committee for consideration and report."

Carried Unanimously.

Burnaby Ratepayers' Council submitted a letter together with a Brief dealing with the present transportation facilities in the Municipality, requesting that the Transportation Committee of their group be invited to attend a meeting sponsored by the Council for the purpose of exploring the question of transportation in Burnaby.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Hughes "That this matter be referred to the Transportation Committee to arrange a meeting at its discretion, and further that copies of the subject brief be made available to all Councillors." Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Hughes withdrew from the meeting.

Pacific Demolition Limited submitted a proposed ground plan for property owned by them and situated at 3013 Kingsway indicating the proposed location of buildings and other appurtenances which they intend to erect in connection with their proposal to utilize this property as a storage centre for plumbing and building materials.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor Cafferky "That this matter be referred to the Chief Licence Inspector for a report as to the proposed operation and also for details pertinent to their existing business in the City of Vancouver."

Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Cafferky withdrew from the meeting.

Stevenson and Kellogg Limited submitted an account in the amount of \$877.70 covering fees and expenses incurred for the months of August and September in recruiting for the position of Municipal Manager.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That a request be made of the firm for an itemized account."

Carried Unanimously.

CKNW Orphans' Christmas Fund wrote requesting permission to stage the CKNW Orphans' Christmas Fund Tag Day on Saturday, December 14th.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That permission be granted."

Carried Unanimously.

T. H. Goode submitted a letter in connection with a proposal to form a Burnaby Community Chest advising that he supported this move to integrate social and welfare collections under one group and that he felt a full investigatory period should be undertaken in order to orientate the people of Burnaby to this form of welfare collections, and in this connection offered his practical support to the Council on a Committee to probe the needs and proper method of approach that should be made to this vital problem.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor W.P.Philps "That the letter be received and Mr.Goode advised that the matter is at the present time being considered."

Carried Unanimously.

Assessment Commissioner submitted a copy of Order-in-Council #2309 setting out the dates for the sittings of the 1958 Court of Revision.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor F.Philps "That this information be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Municipal Solicitor requested authority to acquire an easement over the north 8' of Lots 3,4,5 and 6, the south eight feet of Lots 7,8,9 and 10, and the north 8' of Lots 11, 12, 13 and 14 of Lot "A" of Lot 1, Block 2, D.L.57/58 from Robert Frederick Hayes and Maggie Hayes.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor W.P.Philps "That the necessary authority be granted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Chief Building Inspector submitted a report covering the activities of his Department for the period, September 9th to October 4th, 1957.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Officer in Charge, Burnaby Detachment, R.C.M.P., submitted a report covering policing of the Municipality for September, 1957.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Fire Chief submitted a report of the activities of his Department for the month of September 1957.

Moved by Councillor Hean, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That the report of the Fire Chief be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Personnel Director submitted a report on the activities of his Department for the month of August 1957.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Chief Licence Inspector submitted a report covering the operations of his Department for the month of September, 1957.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Social Service Administrator submitted a comparative report for the first nine months of this year in relation to the same period for the years 1955 and 1956.

Moved by Councillor Brown, seconded by Councillor F.Philps "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Park Board submitted Expenditures for the two week period ended September 6th, 1957 in the amount of \$15,315.06 and for the period ended 20th September 1957 in the amount of \$8,827.55.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the park expenditures be approved."

Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Morrison withdrew from the meeting.

The Treasurer submitted Disbursements for the two week period ended October 4th, 1957 in the amount of \$328,672.15.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the disbursements as submitted be approved."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted Detailed Account of Works for the period, September 16th to 29th, 1957.

Moved by Councillor F.Philps, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the report be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted Board of Works Estimates for the two week period, October 28th to November 10th, 1957 in the amount of \$162,856.80.

Moved by Councillor F.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the estimates as submitted be approved."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted Waterworks Estimates for the two week period October 28th to November 10th, in the amount of \$12,975.00.

Moved by Councillor F.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the Water Works Estimates be approved."

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Engineer submitted Estimates of Works for Garbage Collection for the two week period, October 28th to November 10, 1957 in the amount of \$8,200.00.

Moved by Councillor Brown, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the estimates as submitted be approved."

Carried Unanimously.

The Chief Administrative Officer submitted a report in connection with a complaint of Mr. G. Neuman concerning a notice sent to him from the Municipal Engineer directing that he provide a crossing to his property advising that the Street and Traffic By-law of the Municipality prohibits driving over a sidewalk any vehicle except at locations for which the Municipal Engineer has granted written permission. The Chief Administrative Officer further reported that the sidewalk in question was constructed in 1929 and the estimated lifetime was shown as 20 years, and that as Mr. Neuman built his home in 1946, the then Engineer did not deem it necessary to instal a proper crossing and furthermore, as the sidewalk had been constructed for 28 years, which in spite of it being used as a crossing shows no sign of deterioration, he was of the opinion the Engineer could in this instance grant permission as provided in the Street and Traffic By-law.

Moved by Councillor W. P. Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the report of the Chief Administrative Officer be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Chief Licence Inspector submitted a report in connection with a Sheep Protection Act claim of L. O. Brown for the loss of five (5) chickens valued at \$2.00 each, advising that investigation revealed reasonable precaution was given to the birds and recommending that the claim be met by one-half payment.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Hean "That the recommendation of the Chief Licence Inspector be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

Special Committee submitted a report relative to an application of D. Okos, El Luis Auto Court for permission to establish a trailer court on property owned by them at 3215 Grandview Highway and legally described as Lots 15 and 16 pt., Sketch 10410, Blocks 1 and 2, D.L.74S¹, advising that an inspection of the property revealed that the sanitary nuisance which prevailed in April 1956 has re-occurred and sewage effluent is being discharged onto the property at the rear of the auto court, and on the Woodsworth Street road allowance, and that to eliminate this condition, would in all probability require complete reconstruction of the disposal field system serving the septic tank. The Special Committee further reported that the extent of land required for this disposal field has not as yet been determined, and recommended in the meantime no action be taken on the subject application, nor until it is considered the present auto court sewage disposal system will operate in a satisfactory manner without nuisance either on the subject property or adjoining properties. The Committee also advised that other aspects of this application require attention but that until the matter of sewage control on the existing premises is successfully treated, a proper assessment of these problems cannot be made.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Morrison returned to the meeting.

The Chief Building Inspector submitted a report in regard to the appointment of a Temporary Plumbing Inspector by Council on May 13th of this year, advising that it was originally anticipated that the services of this person could be dispensed with on October 15th but that as there has been a continuing high incidence of Gas Fitting Installations it has been considered necessary to retain this member of the Staff until November 29th, 1957.

Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor F.Philps "That authority be granted to retain this person until November 29th, 1957".

Carried Unanimously.

The Municipal Treasurer submitted a report in connection with the sale of Lot "F" Blocks 13 and 14, D.L.117W¹, Plan 13646 to Swanney Brick & Stone Ltd, advising that in 1954, the Company became bankrupt and was subsequently re-organized under the name of Swanney Concrete Limited, and that recently Deeks-McBride Limited have taken over the assets of this Company and have paid the Municipality interest to date on the outstanding agreement for sale together with the current taxes. The Treasurer advised that it is proposed that this property be Quit Claimed to the Municipality and a new Agreement for Sale entered into between the Corporation and Deeks-McBride Limited permitting the Company to pay the principal sum outstanding of \$7,500.00 over a period of three years together with interest at the rate of 6% per annum; which proposal he concurred in.

Moved by Councillor W.P.Philps, seconded by Councillor F. Philps "That the proposal as outlined be adopted in principal."

Carried Unanimously.

Chairman, Hastings Street Widening Committee, submitted a report advising that they had acted on Council's instructions and engaged the firm of G. W. Clarry & Associates to prepare a preliminary report on the total cost which can be anticipated in settling the claims resulting from the expropriation of lands on Hastings Street and any other costs relative to the procurement of the necessary lands and that such report was estimated to cost \$1,055.00 and is expected to be in their hands by November 1st. The Chairman further advised that an offer to sell the Theatre property has been received but that the Committee has prevailed upon the agent to hold the matter in abeyance until the report of the Consultant has been obtained. The Chairman also reported that after the preliminary report has been made a further study will be necessary before compensation claims can be dealt with and that this subsequent report will cost an estimated \$4,800.00 and will take approximately eight weeks to prepare, but that the need for further study will, of course, be dependent upon the decision of Council as to whether they should proceed with the widening project.
Moved by Councillor F. Philips, seconded by Councillor Morrison "That the report of the Committee be received."

Carried Unanimously.

Municipal Engineer submitted a recommendation that Messrs. V. D. Kennedy, J.W. Milne and himself be authorized to attend the Pacific Northwest Sewage and Industrial Wastes Convention in Seattle on October 24th, 25th and 26th.
Moved by Councillor W.P. Philips, seconded by Councillor Brown "That authority as requested be granted."

Carried Unanimously.

Councillor Hughes returned to the meeting.

Municipal Engineer submitted a report in regard to the installation of a water supply system to the Centennial site advising that an extremely limited supply of water will be available at the site because of the size of pumps and main being installed, and that because of this situation it will be necessary to restrict all non-essential water usage as much as possible.
Moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor F. Philips "That the report of the Municipal Engineer be received."

Carried Unanimously.

The Superintendent of Yards and Garbage submitted a comprehensive report as a result of a survey made into the currently operated garbage system in the Municipality. The Superintendent outlined the present method of garbage pick-up and disposal into the dumping grounds at Stride Avenue and Sperling Avenue. The Superintendent outlined a new type of sanitary fill system of disposal to be introduced at the Stride pit in place of the open-face system of disposal, which while more expensive would prove more efficient. The system of operation at Sperling Avenue pit was also outlined, and it was suggested that in view of the difference in the topography of the ground at this location experiments presently under way had to be conducted further to determine the rate of decomposition, such experiments being necessary due to the high water table in this area. The Superintendent submitted that he was continuing a time study on garbage pick-up schedules and would submit a complete report at a later date.

The Municipal Engineer commented on the dump experimentation at the Sperling Avenue disposal site advising that recent experimentations of the site indicated an exceptionally slow rate of decomposition. The Engineer suggested that certain remedies with the use of cover-fill to overcome any insanitary conditions might be used which would overcome the conditions which might occur as a result of settlement.

Moved by Councillor F. Philips, seconded by Councillor Brown "That both reports be received."

Carried Unanimously.

REPORT OF STAFF LAND SALE COMMITTEE

Your Committee met on October 9, 1957 at 3.00 p.m. to consider the application of John Schmidt to purchase 3.37 acre part of Blocks 27/28, D.L.157 for residential purposes.

The proposed layout for the resubdivision of the Municipal lands in D.L.157 has been found to be impracticable from the point of view obtaining a cancellation in order to effect the new subdivision as proposed by the J. Schmidt Construction Company Limited. In order to make the cancellation, it has been found necessary to eliminate one lot from this proposed layout. The original sale price set on this land was \$61,045.00 based on a figure of 28 units. This is the number of lots obtainable from the land being purchased from the Municipality. Because of the elimination of one lot from this layout the Staff Land Sale Committee feel that 1/28th of the original asking price should be deducted. This would amount to \$2,180.00.

The Committee suggests that this sale be carried through with the company at a figure of \$61,045.00 less \$2,180.00 being the pro-rated cost of one lot. This would then make the sale price for the Municipal land \$68,865.00.

Moved by Councillor Hughes, seconded by Cr. F. Philips "That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted."

Carried Unanimously.

The Planning Engineer submitted a report relative to the proposed enactment by Council of the "Burnaby Auto Court By-law 1957" setting out his observations in respect of the draft By-law. The Planning Engineer accompanied his report with a brief prepared as a result of a comprehensive study made of tourist accommodations both permanent and mobile and made certain recommendations regarding development and location standards for these accommodations.

Moved by Councillor Hughes, seconded by Councillor Brown "That the report of the Planning Engineer be referred to the Auto Court Committee."

Carried Unanimously.

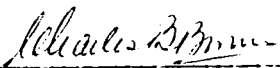
