An Adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Tuesday, September 13, 1960 at 7:30 p.m.

ABSENT - Reeve Emmott and Councillor Harper.

Acting Reeve Jamieson was in the Chair.

The Acting Reeve announced that Mr. Norman D. Lea of Foundation of Canada Engineering Corporation was in attendance and desired an audience with Council for the purpose of presenting a report of his Corporation on the study conducted by it of the Peat lands in the Municipality, and to outline some of the salient features of the report.

Mr. L. Harder submitted a letter in the same vein as the previous

one.

Secretary, Fraser Valley Municipal Association, submitted a letter advising that the Association is sponsoring a banquet at the U.B.C.M. Convention and requesting that, to defray a portion of the costs to be incurred in this connection, this Municipality agree to pay approximately one-half cent per capita as its share. The Sccretary also submitted an account in the sum of \$10.00 representing the annual membership dues of Burnaby in the Association.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MATHER:

"That Council accept the cost sharing arrangement described in the letter from the Fraser Valley Municipal Association and further, the account for \$10.00 covering membership dues in the Association be authorized for payment."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Item No. 8 of Municipal Manager's Report No. 39, 1960 re Sandor Land Company Limited and a portion of Irvine Street was lifted from the table for further consideration.

Street, Wollen and Promislow wrote advising that they have been retained by Mr. J. Jambor of Sandor Land Company Limited for the purpose of presenting his case to Council.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That the representative of Mr. Jambor be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. William A. Street appeared and suggested that it would be in the interests of both the Municipality as a whole and Mr. Jambor in particular if the exchange proposal advanced in the Municipal Manager's Report was implemented. In this connection, he stated that the proposal calls for the yielding by Mr. Jambor of a strip of his property for the widening of Kingsway and, in return, for the acquisition by him of the subject portion of Irvine Street while, at the same time, the Municipality would gain more land, be in a position to extend its sidewalk facilities, and likely increase its tax revenues through the establishment of a commercial development on the site in question. Mr. Street also suggested that there was no question of injurious affection since no one would be made to suffer by the closing of the subject portion of Irvine Street. In this regard, he claimed that the only party who might be affected by this closing (Medical-Dental Building) presently enjoys a large frontage on two streets and, in addition, it has a width of 25-feet available to it which could be used as rear access. He pointed out that the portion of Irvine Street which was Immediately behind the Medical-Dental development was closed at their instance and that therefore it followed that, in the event of damage being claimed by this development, the Municipality could not be held liable since the Medical-Dental development (by virtue of its "closing" actions) would be considered as an instrument of its own misfortune. Mr. Street suggested that Council utilize Section 507(3) of the Municipal

Act - not as a legal requirement but merely to obtain public reaction to the exchange proposal - as a means of ascertaining the possibility of liability for injurious affection. He concluded by requesting that Council consider the publication of a notice of intention to proceed with the exchange in question with the just stated view in mind.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND:

"That the suggestion of Mr. Street concerning utilization of Sub-section (3) of Section 507 of the Municipal Act be made available, in written form, for examination by the Municipal Solicitor and Council."

(9) Sewer Easement - Lot 7, Blocks 1 and 2, D.L. 157, Plan 1261.

The Manager reported that an easement is required over a portion of the above lot and that negotiations for the easement have not been successful. He recommended that expropriation proceedings be instituted to acquire the necessary land for easement purposes.

During consideration of this item, it came to the attention of Council that negotiations had been conducted with someone other than the registered owner of the property in question. Concern was expressed by Council that it was being asked to authorize expropriation proceedings against a deceased person.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE:

"That this matter be referred to the Municipal Solicitor to clarify the registration status of the property in question and to indicate the means by which expropriation proceedings can be conducted."

The Manager reported that negotiations for the acquisition of a proposed road allowance for the above noted extension with the owner of the property required have failed. He advised that an Expropriation By-law has been placed on the Agenda to authorize expropriation proceedings for the acquisition of the property in question -portion of Block 97, D. L. 92, Plan 1146 - owned by a Mr. T. Vanderwiel.

(12) Underground Wiring.

The Manager reported that he had obtained certain information from the City of Victoria concerning the underground wiring programme being carried out in that City. He supplied the answers furnished him by the City of Victoria for the information of Council.

(13) Lane Allowance along South Boundary of Richmond Park.

The Manager reported that a petition was received from a number of residents in the 1100 Block Holly Street requesting permission to fence and use a ten foot lane allowance at the rear of their properties adjacent to Richmond Park. He advised that the Municipality is not able to dispose of its streets and lanes in this fashion and that though there is no possibility of opening the lane, it has been developed by the Parks and Recreation Commission for use in conjunction with the remainder of the Park in question. In this regard, he added that a drainage ditch has been constructed by the Commission to handle the surface water from the Park. The Manager recommended that the petitioners be informed that the Corporation is not permitted to allow private use of public property.
