#### **SEPTEMBER 26, 1960**

An Adjourned Meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hail, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, September 26, 1960 at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

Reeve Emmott in the Chair; Councillors Drummond, Edwards, Harper, Jamieson, MacSorley, Mather and Prittle.

ABSENT - Councillor Hicks.

Reeve Emmott introduced the winner of the Slogan Contest, Mrs. V. M. Mooney, 6981 - 206th Street, R.R. #4, Langley, B. C., advising that her slogan was "BURNABY - A SITE TO SEE".

Councillor M. J. Harper, Chairman of the Burnaby Day Co-Ordinating Committee, informed Mrs. Mooney that the prizes which she had won would be forwarded to her within a few days.

Councillor Hicks arrived at the meeting.

The Municipal Clerk announced that the following organizations desired an audience with Council:

(a) Burnaby Hobby & Museum Centre Society.

(b) Lozells Community Association.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That the delegations from each of these two groups be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

A letter from Mr. W. A. Hagelund, President of the Hobby and Museum Centre Society, was laid before Council. In it, the President asked that Council make a grant of \$524.00 to the Society for the purpose of enabling them to construct a temporary shelter for museum displays.

Mr. Hagelund also spoke and elaborated on the contents of his letter emphasizing that the Society had spent three years in pursuit of its objectives to cultivate and develop social and recreational activities in the Municipality and focus the attention of the public on these activities. He also advised that the Society had obtained, by donation, a steam road roller from the City of Vancouver and a traction engine from Modern Engineering plus other museum and hobby displays, all of which would be housed and protected in the aforementioned shelter. A plan of this shelter, together with a breakdown of the cost of its construction, accompanied the letter from the Society.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR JAMIESON:

"That the letter be received and the request referred to the Committee on Grants for consideration and recommendation."

Mrs. Hutchings of the Lozells Community Association next appeared and presented a petition on behalf of the property owners affected by the Community Plan proposal for the Government Road - South Burquitiam District of the Municipality requesting that Council proceed with zoning control for this area only as the suitability of the properties indicate so that sound development may result and that they also avoid the application of any restrictive Community Plan which would encroach upon individual rights and would discriminate against the property owners concerned.

Mrs. B. Blanchflower, Secretary, Committee on Planning and Zoning, Lozells Community Association, also appeared and presented a Brief on behalf of the same property owners recommending:

- (a) That a judicial commission be instituted immediately to inquire into the reasoning and recommendations of the Planning Department with respect to the use and application of a Community Plan for the area known as "Government Road South Burquitiam District."
- (b) That the Community Plan concept be abolished because discrimination through its use has already appeared and because a change of the Plan within three months of its adoption as a policy has nullified its promise of stability.

The Brief also stated that the residents felt the abuse of the Plan would be amply demonstrated if the first recommendation set out above was adopted by Council.

Parks and Recreation Commission submitted a report in connection with a request of Council to investigate the feasibility of testing the need for launching facilities on the North Arm of the Fraser River advising that observations and study indicated that certain requirements involved in the development of the site would need to be undertaken and that their implementation would necessitate a substantial expenditure. The Commission further advised that it was of the opinion a launching facility on Burrard inlet would prove to be much more popular than one on the Fraser River. They recommended that in view of the substantial costs involved, the provision of a launching facility on the Fraser River be not considered at this time. The Commission also suggested that if fill from river dredging operations (or some other source) could be deposited on the Wiggins Street site at nominal cost, the problem of access would be greatly simplified - in which case, the question of a boat launching station on the river should be reconsidered.

#### (1) Fire Prevention Week.

The Manager reported that the Governor-General of Canada has proclaimed the period between October 9th and October 15th as Fire Prevention Week and that our Fire Chief has requested that Gurnaby do likewise since the Fire Department will be active in its fire prevention campaign during this week.

# (3) Land Acquisition for road purposes (Carleton Avenue and Fir Street).

The Manager reported that a 33 foot portion of the property located at the south-west corner of the above intersection, the East Half of a 4 acre portion of Sketch 11808 except Reference Plan 17051, D. L. 35, is required in order to properly align the payement proposed for Fir Street in a permanent location compatible with the ultimate development of Carleton Avenue. He advised that at present the constructed roadway encroaches on the property in question, owned by the Director of the Veterans' Land Act under agreement for sale to a Mr. J. McLellan, and that this person is aware of this encroachment. The Manager further reported that though subdivision would, in all probability, yield the desired strip for the road, there is no indication that Mr. McLellan wishes to subdivide. The Manager advised that Mr. McLellan has refused to grant the widening strip for a nominal amount but he has offered it at a price of \$500.00 and, in addition, granted permission in writing for the Municipality to proceed with the road construction during negotiations. The Manager concluded by advising that it would appear that the public interest would be best served by the acquisition of the strip in question on the terms outlined by Mr. McLellan and that therefore he was recommending that Council authorize the acquisition of the subject 33 foot portion for the sum of \$500.00.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Councillor Edwards returned to the meeting.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR JAMIESON, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That "BURNABY TAX PAYMENT EXTENSION BY-LAW 1960" be now reconsidered."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR JAMIESON, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That "BURNABY TAX PAYMENT EXTENSION BY-LAW 1960" be now finally adopted, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and the Corporate Seal be affixed thereto."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR JAMIESON:

"That the Council now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Traffic Safety Committee submitted a report in connection with the centre lining of streets advising that, at the present time, streets are centre lined regardless of the significance of the street in terms of traffic movement. They pointed out that a great many motorists have the impression upon seeing the white centre line that the street on which they are travelling is a through street and, therefore, they are apt to be a trifle incautious in expecting cross traffic to stop. The Committee advised that it has reached the conclusion that only through streets should be centre-lined and they so recommended.

They further recommended that the following streets be classified as through streets and, as such, they be given centre-lining treatment:

- Burke Street from Willingdon Avenue to Patterson Avenue. Patterson Avenue from Kingsway to Burke Street. Patterson Avenue from Burke Street to Moscrop Street. Moscrop Street from Boundary Road to Smith Avenue. Moscrop Street from Smith Avenue to Willingdon Avenue.

- Grange Street from Willingdon Avenue to and Including Sussex Avenue.
- Gilpin Street from Royal Oak Avenue to Grandview-Douglas Highway.
- McPherson Avenue from Kingsway to Imperial Street. (8) (9)
- Trapp Road from Willard Avenue to and including Fenwick Street.
- (10) Holmes Street from Cariboo Road to Tenth Avenue. (Holmes Street to stop at Tenth Avenue).

  (11) Curtis Street from Fell Avenue to Sperling Avenue.

  (12) Curtis Street from Sperling Avenue to Duthle Avenue.

- (13) Curtis Street from Duthle Avenue to Centennial Way.

- (14) Halifax Street from Holdom Avenue to Sperling Avenue.
  (15) Gilmore Avenue from Eton Street to Edinburgh Street.
  (16) Gilley Avenue from Kingsway to Imperial Street.
  (17) Gilley Avenue from Imperial Street to and including
  Berwick Street.
- (18) Imperial Street from Sperling Avenue to Griffiths Avenue
- (19) Imperial Street from Grandview-Douglas Highway to
- Walker Avenue. 20) Nelson Avenue from Kingsway to and including Bond Street
- (21) Capitol Drive from Hastings Street to and including Sea Avenue.
- Sea Avenue from Dundas Street to Highfield Drive. Empire Drive from Gamma Avenue to Capitol Drive.
- Empire Drive from Capitol Drive to Hastings Street.
- The Committee further advised that during consideration of the above matter, it became evident that it was impossible to

correlate all transit routes with the through street system since transit routing is influenced mainly by the location and demand of transit patrons. They emphasized that departures from the policy (above recommended) in favour of centre-lining transit routes would defeat the primary intention of the policy and, also, that to authorize transit routes as through streets would result in a hodge-podge of through streets many of which would be useful only to the routes as through streets would result in a hodge-podge of through streets, many of which would be useful only to the Transit Company. The Committee recommended that the Transportation Committee of Council and the Engineering Department meet with the B. C. Electric Company Limited to discuss the matter of deleting centre-lines on those streets either presently used as transit routes, or proposed to be used as such, for the purpose of resolving the conflict or problems which may result from the obliteration of centrelines.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MATHER:

"That the report of the Traffic Safety Committee be tabled for a period of one week and, in the meantime, copies of it be distributed to each member of Council."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

The Council then sat in Camera.

Municipal Manager submitted a report relative to an action for damages commenced by one Donald Cruikshank against the for damages commenced by one Donald Cruikshank against the Municipality for allegedly unlawfully selling his property at the 1957 tax sale; the basis being that the Corporation failed to notify him of the proposed sale of the land on which he held a registered charge. The Manager submitted the opinion of the Municipal Solicitor on this matter pointing out that the Solicitor was of the view that the Municipality was liable. The Manager recommended that the claim of Donald Cruikshank be fully settled in the amount of \$2,573.54.

"That the recommendation of the Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Municipal Manager submitted a report in connection with a claim of Mr. and Mrs. Arnold McCready, 4142 Maywood Street, and their insurance company, for damages which occurred when the Municipal Sewer surcharged on December 14, 1959. The Manager advised that a mutually agreeable compromise settlement was sought, with the result that he was now recommending:

That the sum of \$200.00 be paid to the insurance company involved in full settlement of their claim, subject to the necessary releases being obtained. That the sum of \$121.00 be paid to the McCreadys in full settlement of their claim.

(b) In full settlement of their claim, also subject to the necessary release being obtained.

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Municipal Manager submitted a report recommending that Council authorize the acquisition of the North 9 feet and the South 10 feet of Lot 5, Block "G", D. L. 127, West 3/4, Plan 1254, owned by one William G. P. Cassidy, for the sum of \$4,000.00.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:

"That the recommendation of the Municipal Manager be adopted."
