He cited an instance whereby the Committee was informed that only two accidents have occurred at the corner of Bainbridge Avenue and Government Street whereas
sworn testlmony from residents in the area indicated that at least five or six accicients had occurred at the same location during the same period of time. Councillor Hicks further stated that the R.C.M.P. representative on the Committee had advised that the records of the R.C.M.P. were accurate and up to date.

He requested that an investigation be made of the situation to determine why the accident information in question was not accurately.recorded in the Engineering Department of the Municipality.
