# OCTOBER 30, 1961

A Regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hoff, 4545 East Grandview Douglas Highway, on Monday, October 30, 1961 at 7:30 p.m.

- PRESENT: Reeve Emmott in the Chair; Councillors Clark, Drummond, Harper, Hicks, Jamleson and MacSorley
- ABSENT: Councillors Edwards and Prittie

Reverend E. G. Byers led in Opening Prayer.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR JAMIESON, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS:

"That the Minutes of the meetings held October 10th, 16th, and 23rd, 1961, be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

COUNCILLOR EDWARDS ARRIVED AT THE MEETING.

Jack Gillmore Limited where requesting the opportunity of addressing council for the purpose of presenting preliminary plans of a proposed Multiple Family development on property described as Lot "B", Blocks 43/44, D. L. 35, Plan 4526.

> MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CLARK:

"That a representative from this Company be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Gillmore appeared and introduced Mr. Robert Harrison, Architect, and advised that Mr. Harrison would explain the proposal to Council.

Mr. Harrison then displayed plans of the development contemplated and explained that the proposal is to establish terraced housing on the property in question. Mr. Harrison indicated that between 55 and 59 such units would be provided at an estimated cost of \$10,000.00 each and that the total investment in the development would be approximately \$700,000.00.

Mr. Harrison pointed out that the proposed development features, among other things, a high degree of privacy for the occupants in each unit.

"That the application to rezone the property in question to Multiple Family use be tabled for a period of one week and reports be submitted at that time by the Planning Department on the question of establishing row housing on the subject property and from the Engineering Department on the matter of whether existing services to the property could support the kind of development contemplated."

<u>Mrs. Anne Schaefer</u> submitted a latter requesting permission to make alterations to a building located at 5620 Hastings Street.

# REPORT OF TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

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# (1) Provincial Safety Conference.

The Committee recommended that Mr. D. Mills be authorized to attend both the 1961 Safety Conference being held in Vancouver between November 16th and November 16th and also the Pre-Conference Traffic Safety Workshop on November 15th, as the delegate from this Municipality.

The Committee added that the registration fee for the Comference itself is \$10.00 and for the Workshop, \$5.00.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That Mr. Mills be authorized to attend both of the functions mentioned in the report of the Traffic Safety Committee and further, that the two fees listed be paid."

# (2) Rumble Street and Buller Avenue.

The Committee reported that investigation of a request for a school crossing at the above noted location indicated that though such an installation is not warranted at this time, it would be within a year or so.

The Committee recommended:

- (a) That a school crossing be installed on Rumble Street at the west crosswalk of Buller Avenue;
- (b) That the said west crosswalk be painted;
- (c) That advance warning pavement symbols be painted on Rumble Street east and west of the crossing;
- (d) That the Principal of Clinton Street School be requested to consider the institution of a School Patrol at the new crossing.

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# MUNICIPAL MANAGER -- REPORT NO. 50, 1961.

# (1) Tax Sale - Lot 23, Block 50, D. L. 189 (Thompson).

The Manager reported that monies paid by the above noted on property taxes had, through inadvertence on the part of a collection agent for the Corporation, been applied on the wrong property, with the result that another lot owned by Mr. Thompson (to which he intended that the monies so paid be credited) had been sold at the 1961 Tax Sale to a Mr. Frank Weisberger. The Manager pointed out that had the payments been applied as Mr. Thompson intended, the delinquent taxes would have been paid and the property not sold at the 1961 Tax Sale.

The Manager also advised that Section 409(2) of the Municipal Act provides authority for Council to refund monies paid by a tax sale purchaser if, during the period allowed for redemption, a manifest error is found.

The Manager recommended that Council pass the necessary resolution to permit the return of the monies paid by the tax sale purchaser, Mr. Weisberger, and to permit the Treasurer to reinstate the property in question (the above described Lot 23) to the property tax roll.

#### (3) <u>Request to repair building at 5620 Hastings Street</u> (Schaefer).

The Manager submitted a report on a request of the above noted (reference to which is made earlier in these Minutes) describing the condition of the building proposed to be renovated and setting out the views of the various Departments with respect to the request at hand. He added that Mrs. Schaefer has been made aware on several occasions since May 1961 of the problems in connection with the subject building but has never made any formal application for the proposed alterations.

The Manager recommended that the request of Mrs. Schaefer be denied because of the situation in regard to the present condition of the building, the Hastings Street Widening By-Law, the Building By-Law, and a requirement of the Health Department concerning the need for a sewer connection.

# (4) Still Creek Right-of-Way,

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The Manager reported that in 1944 the Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District compiled a right-of-way plan for that portion of Still Creek located in Burnaby; which plan was accepted by the then Council and subsequently deposited in the Land Registry Office.

He advised that the District has now indicated that no formal agreements were entered into to grant easements to the District over the following five parcels of land which are owned by the Corporation:

# (5) Gauge House - Greater Vancouver Water District (10th Avenue and Newcombe Street).

The Manager reported that the Greater Vancouver Water District has indicated that it is prepared to relocate a Gauge House from its present position at 10th Avenue and Newcombe Street to a location on Lot 20, Block 3, D. L. 25, Plan 1169 (north-west corner of Newcombe Street and 10th Avenue), as shown on Engineering Drawing No. L.130.

He added that the said Lot 20 is owned by the Corporation and that part of it is to be used in connection with the widening and construction of Newcombe Street. He also advised that the cost of relocating the Gauge House would be assumed by the Water District.

The Manager recommended that Council authorize the relocation of the Gauge House, as outlined in the report.

He pointed out that the bid of the lowest tenderer, M. & C. Contractors Limited, is in an amount which is appreciably higher than that originally estimated by the Architect engaged to design the building in question. He pointed out that the total estimated cost of the project, using the lowest tender, is as follows:

The Manager also pointed out that Council on August 7th had opproved preliminary estimates for the project in question in the amount of \$153,000.00 and, on August 21st, the Department of Municipal Affairs indicated that it was prepared to recommend approval of our application to appropriate this amount from our Tax Sale Moneys Trust Account.

The Manager recommended:

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- (a) That the tender of M. & C. Contractors Limited in the amount of \$166,112.00 for the construction of the new Headquarters Building for the Public Library be accepted;
- (b) That the total estimated cost of the project -\$185,012.00 be approved;
- (c) That application be made to the Department of Municipal Affairs for approval to appropriate an additional amount of \$32,012.00 from our Tax Sale Moneys Trust Account;
- (d) That the project be included in the forthcoming Winter Works Incentive Programme.

The Manager further advised that representatives of the Library Board would be in attendance at the meeting this evening to support the foregoing recommendation.

Mr. G. Jones, Chief Librarian for the Board, spoke and pointed out that the tender call included an item for the completion of a future reading room  $\sim \cos t \$7,755...0$ . Mr. Jones stressed that completion of this room concurrently with the construction of the Library would result in a substantial saving. He added that an item for heat ducts was also included in the tender call.

Mr. Jones also stated that the low tenderer had a good financial standing and had built other public buildings.

REEVE EMMOTT VACATED THE CHAIR.

ACTING REEVE MacSORLEY ASSUMED IT.

AND WHEREAS Council doems that a manifest error had therefore been made in the proceedings prior to the tax sale of Lot 23 AND WHEREAS notice of tax sale has not yet been filed in the Land Registry Office AND WHEREAS the period allowed for redemption of the sold Lot 23 has not expired THEREFORE 3E IT RESOLVED THAT pursuant to sub-rection (2) of Section 409 of the Municipal Act:

- 1. The purchase price of 3365.20 paid by the said Frank Weisberger for the said Lot 23 b, returned to him with interest at the rate of six (6%) per cent per annum, and
- The taxes upon the said Lot 23, as they appeared upon the real property tax roll prior to the said tax sale on September 30 h, 1961, be restored to the said roll."

The Planning Director further advised that the Department of Public Works for the Province has recently indicated:

- (a) That it is still opposed to the extension of Woodsworth Street between Westminster Avenue and Willingdon Avenue;
- (b) That an east-west through street connection might be provided between Westminster Avenue and Willingdon Avenue, and possibly west of Willingdon Avenue to Carleton Avenue, but that further consideration would have to be given the matter of alignment;
- (c) That it does not wish to have a north-south road allowance between the Drive-In Theatre site and its own holdings to the west;
- (d) That its endeavour to have the Westminster Avenue diversion allowance shared equally between the Cemetery Company and the Provincial Government along the west boundary of the Cemetery property has not been fruitful;
- (e) That the proposed siting of a new building addition to the Vocational Institute has been altered so that the Westminster Avenue diversion can be carried south of Woodsworth Street without conflict with building development.

On the question of traffic ramifications of the Drive-In Theatre proposal, the Planning Director advised that the Department of Highways feels:

- That the proposed development would necessitate the installation of a left turn slot at Grandview-Douglas Highway and Westminister Avenue and that the developers should be prepared to defray the cost of providing this traffic improvement;
- (2) That the screen location will be a traffic hazard to westbound traffic on the Highway unless it is located so as to not be visibl: to Highway users.

Robert R. Maitland and Company, Barristers and Solicitors, representing Odcon Theorem (B. C.) Limited, submitted a further letter requesting a 60 day deferment on the subject rezoning.
