#### APRIL 30, 1962

An Adjourned Meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, April 30, 1962 at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT:

Acting Reeve R. E. Hicks in the Chair; Councillors Blair, Edwards, Harper, Kalyk, MacSorley and Prittie

ABSENT:

Reeve A. H. Emmott and Councillor

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:

"That all of the below listed correspondence be received."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. G. L. Burnett wrote protesting the decision of Council with respect to his claim for flooding damages. He also indicated that he would use other means available to have the Council reconsider its position in regard to his claim.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED LY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:

"That the previous decision of Council to deny liability in respect to the claim of Mr. Burnett for flooding damages be re-affirmed."

CARRIED COUNCILLOR KALYK -AGAINST.

Amaigamated Association of Street, Electric Railway and Motor Coach Employees of America submitted a Brief expressing certain views in support of public ownership of a transit system.

The proposal of Brigadier General Manning concerning the acquisition by a private Company of the transit system from the municipalities, which was received by Council on April 24th, was lifted from the table at this time.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HARPER, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:

"That both the submission of Brigadier General Manning and the one from the Amalgamated Association of Street, Electric Railway and Motor Coach Employees of America be tabled for an indefinite period of time."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HARPER:

"That the Reeve be requested to obtain, if possible, from the forthcoming meeting of Mayors and Reeves an indication as to whether a full investigation should be made into the substance of the "Manning" proposal (i.e., whether Mr. Manning or the Company he advocates is ready, willing and able to perform); and further, that it be suggested to the Reeve that a resolution emanate from the aforementioned meeting requesting the Provincial Government to indicate in more precise detail what the intentions of that Government will be in regard to the disposal of the transit system, at such time as the relative positions of the Government and the B. C. Power Corporation are clarified through the Court action now pending (and in the event the ruling is favourable to the Government)."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

<u>Secretary, Fraser Valley Municipal Association</u>, submitted advice that the Annual Mceting of the Association has been postponed until May 16th at 8:00 p.m., and that the meeting will be held in White Rock, B. C.

Reeve Emmott submitted a report recommending that Councillor W. A. Blair be appointed as Acting Reeve for the months of May and June 1962.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That the recommendation of the Reeve be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HARPER:

"That the Council now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

### MUNICIPAL MANAGER -- REPORT NO. 23, 1962.

(1) Easement - Northerly 7 feet of Lot 7, S.D. 1, Block 3, D. L. 35, Plan 15110 (Elgie).

The Manager recommended that Council authorize the acquisition of the above described easement, which is required in connection with the joint sewage and drainage proposal on Boundary Road, for a consideration of 12.00 plus restoration of the easement area.

He also recommended that Council authorize the execution of the easement documents.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HARPER, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS:

"That the recommendations of the Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

# (2) Easement - West 20 feet of Lot 25, Blocks 1/3, D. L. 43, Plan 3227 (Ferguson and Dickinson).

The Manager recommended that Council authorize the acquisition of the above described easement, which is required in connection with the construction of a sanitary sewer to the plant of Peter's Ice Cream, for a consideration of \$1.00 plus restoration of the easement territory.

He also recommended that Council authorize the execution of the easement documents.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR KALYK:

"That the recommendations of the Municipal Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

## (3) Easement - North 15 feet of Lot 1, S.D. "B", Block 60, D. L. 98, Plan 7278 (Kuramitsu).

The Manager recommended that Council authorize the acquisition of the above described easement, which is required in connection with Phase 2 of the South Slope sewer project, for a consideration of \$360.00 plus restoration of the easement area.

He also recommended that Council authorize the execution of the easement documents.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HARPER, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:

"That the recommendations of the Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

#### (4) Investments.

The Manager submitted a report recommending that the action taken by the Treasurer in transferring the following securities from the "Reserve for U.S. Exchange Account" to the "Dog Pound Reserve Account" for the purpose of providing funds in the first mentioned Reserve be ratified:

(5) Willingdon Avenue between Hastings Street and Pender Street.

The Manager recommended that Council authorize the following stopping and parking prohibitions:

- (1) East side of Willingdon Avenue between Hastings Street and the lane south of Hastings Street.
  - (a) No stopping 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.
  - (b) One Hour Parking 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- (2) Both sides of Willingdon Avenue between Pender Street and the lane south of Hastings Street.
  - (a) One Hour Parking 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

He also recommended that authority be granted to convert the existing bus stop on the west side of Willingdon Avenue between Hastings Street and the lane south of Hastings Street to a bus zone.

He pointed out that these prohibitions are considered necessary in order to relieve congestion which occurs during peak hours on the subject portion of Willingdon Avenue and also, in general, to improve the traffic situation in this block.

He added that the Municipal Engineer has authority under the Street and Traffic By-law to institute these traffic control measures but it was felt that since these measures are rather far reaching, Council should be apprized of the proposals before their implementation.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:

"That the recommendation of the Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

## (6) Tenders - Dust Laying Oil.

The Manager submitted a report requesting authority to call for tenders for the supply and application of dust laying oil for the current year.

He pointed out that it is proposed to specify that a product composed of fifty percent discard oil will be accepted or, optionally, a product known as "Standard Oil Special Dust Layer", or equal, the latter to provide for the eventuality of the supply of the discard oil product being depleted. He also mentioned that it is to be clearly specified that only one unit price will be recognized, with no compensation being allowed for having to use the more expensive product should this become necessary.

The Manager further reported that since the above outlined specifications were prepared, a letter had been received claiming that used oil is toxic. He advised that this claim is being investigated by a competent authority and, should it be verified, it will be necessary to redraw the specifications to eliminate the proposed use of used oil.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:

"That authority be granted to call tenders, as requested in the report of the Municipal Manager."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

#### (7) Local Improvement Construction By-Law No. 7, 1959, Amendment By-Law 1962.

The Manager reported that Burnaby Local Improvement Construction By-Law No. 7, 1959 authorized, among other works, the construction of a four foot sidewalk on the north and north-west sides of Hastings Street west of Inlet Drive. He advised that this work was not completed due to acquisition problems caused by the realignment of Hastings Street.

The Manager reported that the purpose of the Amending By-law is to delete the portion of the work not constructed.

He recommended that this Amendment By-law be passed.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:

"That the recommendation of the Manager be adopted."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

#### (8) Antrim Avenue South from Beresford Street.

The Manager submitted a report supplying information as to the cost of constructing Antrim Avenue south from its present termination to Watling Street.

He pointed out that inspection of this Avenue revealed that there presently exists an adequate access to the vacant property owned by Imperial Industries Ltd. and that it would therefore not be necessary to extend Antrim Avenue to provide such access.

The Manager pointed out that the construction of Antrim Avenue south to Watling Street on the existing allowance is not considered practical since Watling Street has been cancelled. He advised that the construction of Antrim Avenue over the new diversion to Watling Street could be done for an estimated cost of \$7,100.00 (gravel standard). He also advised that the estimated cost of continuing the construction of the Antrim Avenue diversion south from Watling Street to MacPherson Avenue is \$5,200.00, adding that there is a wading pool and ball diamond located on this diversion.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HARPER, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR PRITTIE:

"That the report of the Manager be received."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

#### (9) Estimates.

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The Manager submitted a report of the Municipal Engineer

covering estimates of work in the total amount of \$47,763.00 recommending that they be approved.





#### (11) Verbal

Municipal Manager reported that an application has been received from the Vancouver Bible Institute for approval in principle to use Blocks 6 and 7, D. L. 15, Plan 209 as a Bible Institute.

He advised that the Planning Department had indicated that there were certain matters which should first be resolved before full approval is given by Council; these matters being:

- (1) That a reasonable reconciliation of the proposed Campus with the future residential development in the surrounding area be achieved.
- (2) That those areas proposed for residential accommodation for both single and married persons be rezoned to Multiple Family use. This would need to be the subject of a further application by your Institute at such time as it is proposed to utilize the area involved for such purposes.
- (3) That all structures and accommodations be approved by the Building and Health Departments.
- (4) That the watercourse be regraded to the requirements of the Engineering Department of this Corporation and of the Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District.
- (5) That the question of providing peripheral roads in such a fashion as to achieve a reasonable relationship of the Campus to the future residential area be arranged to the satisfaction of the Corporation.
- (6) That any modifications which are deemed necessary in the present boundaries of the site (which may necessitate an exchange of lands) be likewise arranged to the satisfaction of both this Corporation and your Institute.

The Manager recommended that Council approve the application in principle, subject to the resolution of the matters listed above.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR:

"That the recommendation of the Manager be adopted."
