A Regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, March 23, 1964 at 7:30 p.m.

Reverend D. Richie led in Opening Prayer.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS: "That the Minutes of the meetings held March 9th and 16th, 1964 be adopted as written and confirmed."

Secretary-Manager, South Burnaby Branch No. 83, Royal Canadian Legion, wrote requesting permission to hold a Parade on April 25th commencing at 4:30 p.m. along Kingsway between the parking lot of Kelly Douglas & Company Limited and the parking lot of the Branch.

Municipal Manager reported verbally that the Legal Department had informed him that the vendor of the subject property had instructed the Corporation to pay Mr. lannucci the sum of \$14,903.55 and it is therefore felt that the Corporation is not liable for the interest amounting to \$60.02 which Mr. lannucci is requesting.

recommending that the existing Fireworks Regulation By-law be amended to:

(1) Ban the sale and use of all fire-crackers.

- (2) Confine the use of display-type fireworks to private property.
- (3) Incorporate a code of safety regulations which would stipulate that, when selling fireworks, a comprehensive instruction sheet setting out the terms of the By-law and the safety precautions that must be taken be issued at the time of sale.

The Committee also recommended that the aforementioned Dealers Committee, in co-operation with the P.T.A., the Safety Council and any other interested organization, use their resources to promote a safety education programme amongst the public and the dealers in fireworks.

It added that permits for public displays of fireworks would be issued in accordance with the rules and regulations currently in force.

Councillor Dailly stated that a building in the 4500 Block Neville Street has been partially demolished and its remnants, constitute not only an eyesore to the neighbourhood but a public hazard as well.

While discussions were taking place in connection with this matter, information came forward that steps had been taken recently to remove the structure mentioned.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY: "That the matter referred to by Councillor Dailly be investigated and, if the removal of the building in question has not been effected, then appropriate action be taken to ensure that this is done."

Councilior Wells broached the question of intersectional improvements at Grandview-Douglas Highway and Gilpin Street. He pointed out that this matter has been the subject of discussion by Council on a number of occasions in the past few months and correspondence has also been exchanged between the Municipality and the Department of Highways with respect to the intersection. He added that the latest communication from the Department of Highways indicated that it is not prepared to consider any changes at the intersection until after the Freeway is opened and the traffic situation involving the intersection can be observed.

Councillor Wells stated that he felt the matter should not remain dormant.

It was suggested that attention should be directed by the Corporation to the holdings of the Church mentioned to determine the possibility of the Corporation acquiring the land.

Reeve Emmott assured Council that the matter was receiving attention by officials of the Corporation.
