

APRIL 6, 1964

A Regular meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, April 6, 1964 at 7:30 p.m.

PRESENT: Reeve Emmott in the Chair;
Councillors Cafferky, Dailly,

ABSENT: Councillors Blair and Edwards

Reverend A. N. Banks led in Opening Prayer.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS:
"That the Minutes of the meeting held March 23, 1964 be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:
"That Councillors Edwards and Blair be granted leave of absence from this meeting."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Edwards, Edwards & Edwards, wrote requesting an opportunity to address Council in connection with an application to rezone Lots 1 to 3 inclusive, S. D. 1/18 and 21/23, Block 3, D. L. 28S, Plan 2105 to Gasoline Service Station.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DAILLY:
"That the delegation be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Robert Edwards appeared and stated that he had learned just before the meeting that the Planning Department would be submitting a report on the subject rezoning application. Mr. Edwards requested that Council defer his presentation on the application until the report from the Planning Department is received.

It was tacitly agreed by Council that the request of Mr. Edwards would be granted.

MOTION LOST

Executive Director, Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board, submitted a letter seeking the views of Council on the five questions that the Board propounded when it presented "Chance and Challenge" earlier this year.

Commissioner, Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District, submitted a Brief containing his comments on the question of extending the operations of the Sewerage and Drainage District into the Fraser Valley region.

"That the matter broached by the Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board in its letter, together with that covered by the Commissioner of the Greater Vancouver Sewerage and Drainage District in his letter, be tabled for consideration after the report of the Municipal Manager this evening."

Secretary, Burnaby Concert Band, wrote extending an invitation to Council to attend a public concert that is to be held on April 19th at 8:00 p.m. in the Burnaby Central Senior Secondary School Auditorium.

Division Manager, Transportation, B. C. Hydro and Power Authority, submitted a letter describing certain changes which the Authority proposes to make in the current services being performed by both Pacific Stage Lines and the B. C. Hydro and Power Authority as a result of the creation of the Freeway.

"That a letter be despatched to Mr. Wilson expressing the appreciation of this Municipality for the efforts expended by him on behalf of regional planning while serving as the Executive Director of the Lower Mainland Regional Planning Board, and also congratulating him on his new appointment."

Municipalities, forwarded a copy of a letter written by the Provincial Secretary conveying the latter's appreciation to the Union for the rapport that was established between the U.B.C.M. office and the Secretary during his tenure of office as the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

Reeve Emmott stated that he had personally written to the Honourable W. D. Black conveying the appreciation of this Municipality for the co-operation that has been displayed by him during his term of office as Minister of Municipal Affairs.

Refinery Manager, Shell Canada Limited, submitted a letter explaining the process employed by the Company in emitting extraneous products resulting from its refining operations and stressing that the Company endeavours to control air pollution as best it can with the financial and technical means available.

The Refinery Manager also extended an invitation to Council to visit the Plant of the Company to observe its operation, particularly that aspect relating to the controls exercised in combating the degree of emissions that are discharged into the air.

Refinery Manager, Standard Oil Company of British Columbia Limited, also submitted a letter in connection with the same matter covered in the previous letter.

REPORT OF THE POLICY COMMITTEE

A report of the Policy Committee, attached to and forming part
of these Minutes, was dealt with as follows:

(1) Machinery Tax.

Reeve Emmott stated that a meeting **was** held last Friday
in our Municipal Hall between representatives from all
municipalities currently imposing a machinery tax. He related
the salient features of the meeting and indicated that it had
been unanimously agreed that an approach should be made to the
Provincial Government in an attempt to have the legislative
change which would preclude municipalities from continuing to
impose a machinery tax not promulgated by proclamation. He
added that it is expected the matter will remain dormant until
a discussion is held between the Minister of Municipal Affairs
and representatives from the aforementioned municipalities.
Reeve Emmott also advised that, if the Minister concurs with
the view of the municipalities involved or agrees to delay
implementation of the proposed legislation, it is possible the
effective date of the new legislation may differ from that which
is presently anticipated.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CAFFERKY, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY:
"That the recommendations of the Policy Committee be adopted
on the understanding that full recognition will be given the
situation that might develop as a result of the overtures being
made to the Minister of Municipal Affairs by the municipalities
to which Reeve Emmott alluded."

It was added that, also to be taken into account as an off-setting consideration, is the amount that can be anticipated from recoveries under the Winter Work Incentive Programme.
