JUNE 8, 1964

An Adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, on Monday, June 8, 1964 at 7:30 p.m.

COUNCILLOR EDWARDS LEFT THE MEETING.

As agreed to by Council on June 1st, Mr. Robert Edwards, Barrister and Solicitor, was present to speak to an application to rezone Lots 1 to 3 inclusive, S.D. 1/18 and 21/23, Block 3, D. L. 28S, Plan 2105 from Residential Two-Family to Gasoline Service Station.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS: "That Mr. Edwards be heard."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Mr. Edwards then spoke and advised that he had had several interviews with officials of the Corporation since the Public Hearing on the rezoning proposal in question and had found that there is opposition to the rezoning. He added that he had received a copy of the report received at the last meeting of Council embodying the views of both the Planning Department and Engineering Department on the rezoning proposal.

Mr. Edwards stated that, as far as he knew, there was still uncertainty in the minds of certain Corporation officials as to whether additional road width will be required for Grandview-Douglas Highway north from 10th Avenue. He averred that the intending developer is prepared to dedicate a ten foot strip from the westerly side of the subject property for road purposes whether this strip is eventually used for that purpose or not. He added that the donation of this land would in no way affect the construction of the Station that is proposed for the site nor will it interfere with the function of the operation planned.

The Municipal Engineer stated that, though some consideration has been given to future road requirements for Grandview-Douglas Highway at 10th Avenue, the Corporation was not yet in a position to determine the ultimate requirement. He suggested that there would be no harm in the Corporation acquiring the ten foot strip being offered by the proposed developer plus a ten foot by ten foot truncation from the south-westerly corner of the site.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HERD, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY: "That all of the below listed correspondence be received."

COUNCILLOR EDWARDS RETURNED TO THE MEETING.

Sccretary-Manager, British Columbia Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, wrote seeking permission to hold a Tag Day on November 14th.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HERD, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR: "That permission be granted to the Society to conduct its campaign on the date mentioned."

Chairman, Local Sponsoring Committee, #637 Squadron, Royal Canadian Air Cadets, wrote requesting permission to hold its Annual Church Parade on June 14th commencing at 10:15 a.m. from the Old Orchid Shopping Centre on Kingsway, thence west to the Church of St. John the Divine at Smith Avenue and return via the same route.

The Chairman also requested that Police escort service be provided for this Parade.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR BLAIR, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS: "That permission be granted to the Committee to conduct its Parade at the time mentioned and along the route described, subject to the approval of the R.C.M.P."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Chairman, Burnaby Week Parade Committee, Kinsmen Club of North Burnaby, submitted a letter requesting permission to hold a Burnaby Week Parade on September 19th commencing at 1:30 p.m. on Hastings Street, thence along this street from Ingleton Avenue to Willingdon Avenue and then south on Willingdon Avenue to the Brentwood Shopping Centre.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HICKS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY: "That permission be granted to the Committee to conduct the Parade at the time mentioned and along the route described."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Professor and Director, School of Social Work. The University of British Columbia, submitted a letter conveying the appreciation of his School for the assistance rendered by the Municipality in accommodating trainees of the School and providing them with facilities and experience that are considered to be integral parts of the programme for students of Social Work.

Request of Mr. G. Hoyer for permission to provide vehicle parking facilities on the northerly 200 feet of Lot 2, Block $1E_2$, D. L. 162, Plan 5452 in conjunction with a proposal to establish a Club-type Health Centre Building.

The Executive Assistant to the Municipal Manager displayed a plot plan showing the total proposed development and an approximate indication as to the location of the planned parking facilities.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EDWARDS, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MacSORLEY: "That, pursuant to Section 13 of Burnaby Town Planning By-Law 1940, the application of Mr. G. Hoyer for permission to provide vehicle parking facilities on the northerly 200 feet of the property described above in conjunction with his proposal to establish a Club-type Health Centre Building be approved."
