FEDRUARY 13, 1967

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, Gurnaby 2, B.C., on Monday, February 13, 1967, at 7:30 p.m.

As a result of a question from His Worship, Reeve Emmott, it was agreed that the members of Council would meet with the School Board on Wednesday, February 15, 1967, at 4 p.m. to discuss the proposed 1967 Budget of the Board.

"That the Minutes of the meeting held January 30, 1967, be adopted as written and confirmed."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Chairman, Royal Canadian Air Cadets, No. 637 "Arrow" Squadron, submitted an invitation to a representative of Council to attend the Annual Banquet of the Squadron at the Bonsor Recreational Centre on February 17th at 7 p.m.

Councillor Lorimer was delegated to represent Council at the Danquet of the No. 637 "Arrow" Squadron.

<u>Guardian Secretary; Bethel No. 34</u>, International Order of Job's Daughters, wrote requesting permission to hold a Peanut Drive on the evenings of February 22nd and 23rd, and possibly on the evenings of March 1st and 2nd, in the area East of Boundary Road and North of Grandview-Douglas Highway.

The Centennial Committee submitted a report, a copy of which is attached to and forms part of these Minutes, dealing with a street beautification campaign.

During consideration of the report, His Worship, Roove Emmott, read the contents of a memo, from the Parks Administrator relating to the estimated cost of landscaping the area around the Inter-Urban Tram at Kingsway and Edmonds Street and also the planting of a hedge along the property line separating the site occupied by the Tram from the Bus Loop.

The cost in question, as contained in the memo. from the Parks Administrator, was \$2,000.00.

His Worship, Reeve Emmott, also indicated that he felt there was a need for more adequate lighting of the Tram and for other measures designed to protect it from vandalism.

A suggestion was made that perhaps the Tram was not situated in the most suitable location for viewing by the public.

Regarding the matter of lighting for the Tram, the Municipal Engineer stated that to the best of his recollection the estimated cost of this was \$600.00.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR HERD, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR McLEAN:
"That the plan of the Centennial Committee outlined in its report be
approved in principle, on the understanding that the positioning and
dimensions of the tubs involved will be arranged in accordance with the

provided the design and specification of the tubs meets with its approval."

- (a) establish a central financing authority for hospital construction;
- (b) revise the cost-sharing formula for such construction.

He pointed out that representations toward this end were made to, and by, the Union of B.C. Hunicipalities over the past, and it would seem that these efforts have produced an awareness on the part of the Provincial Government of the critical situation respecting the financing problems for hospital construction.

His Worship suggested that Council should commend both the Minister of Health Services and Hospital Insurance plus the Minister of Municipal Affairs for being instrumental in introducing the policies announced by the Minister of Health Services and Hospital Insurance last Friday.

Municipal Manager read a report from the Planning Director on this rezoning proposal containing the following advice with respect to the prerequisites which were established by Council in connection with the matter:

- (i) The Secretary-Treasurer of the Burnaby School Board has indicated that the Board has approved the proposed land exchange which was detailed in the report that Council received from the Planning Department when the application was initially considered.
- (ii) The applicant has deposited the sum of \$19,500.00 to cover the cost of providing the site with sanitary sewer and storm drainage facilities.
- (iii) As regards the third prerequisite concerning the availability of sanitary sewer service for the property, this is dependent upon the Corporation receiving 50% of the cost of constructing the trunk sewer between the Brunette Interceptor and the Lougheed Highway from the developers of the Lougheed Mall Shopping Centre. This sum has not yet been received and, should this situation prevail after the development proposal for the property covered by the Amendment Dy-Law under consideration this evening, it is possible the Municipality might be committed to the full expenditure for the installation of the trunk sewer. The Corporation could, however, refuse occupancy of the completed apartment building and there is always the question of whether a building permit could be issued for this apartment when no sewer service is available.

The Municipal Manager stated that, though there would appear to be a slight problem insofar as the prerequisite involving the availability of sewer service to the property is concerned, he felt the developers of the Lougheed Mail Shopping Centre were obliged to deposit the 50% referred to above because they are committed by an agreement with the Corporation.

Mr. R. W. Hassard, President of the Burnaby Chamber of Commerce, appeared and presented a Grief in connection with Industrial and Commercial development in the Municipality.

The Brief emphasized the need for the creation of an effective partnership between business and government, and suggested that this could be achieved by the Municipality engaging an Industrial Co-ordinator.

It was pointed out in the Brief that the efforts expended by such a Co-ordinator should accelerate industrial progress and produce maximum community prosperity. It added that the primary functions of such an office would be the producing of pertinent information for prospective industrial developers with a view to promoting the Municipality as an ideal community in which to locate.

The Grief also stressed the importance of stimulating interest in the Municipality by providing an encouraging climate for business.

With respect to the role of the Industrial Co-ordinator, the Brief suggested that such a person should work in close liaison with the various public and private industrial development groups in an effort to promote industrial interest in the Municipality.

The Brief concluded by urging that Council appoint a Committee to examine the subject in datail with a view to recommending the implementation of an arrangement such as that advocated this evening.

It was also mentioned that the Gurnaby Chamber of Commerce would co-operate in the resolution of this mat ε_{\star}

In response to a question, Mr. Hassard stated that the Chamber was not disheartened by the attitude which presently prevailed in the Municipal Hall respecting the handling of enquiries from persons interested in locating industrial establishments in the municipality; rather, it is felt that no one Department has the resources or time to spend to adequately provide this service.
