JANUARY 3, 1967

The 1967 (naugural Meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4545 East Grandview-Douglas Highway, Burnaby 2, D.C., on Tuesday, January 3, 1967, at 8:00 p.m.

Reverend A. R. Waller opened the meeting with a prayer.

MagIstrate C. M. Hyde officiated at the Swearing-in Ceremony of the Councillors-Elect.

The following took the Oath of Allegiance and were duly sworn in by Magistrate Hyde:

HIS WORSHIP, REEVE EMMOTT, then delivered his Inaugural Address in which he expressed appreciation to Magistrate Hyde and Reverend Waller for their participation in the ceremonies.

He also drew attention to a gavel, known as the "Centennial Travelling Gavel", which he said had been presented to him that afternoon by Mayor Gifford of New Westminter.

He advised that this Gavel will be delivered to Mayor-Elect Campbell of Vancouver for his Inaugural Meeting and, during the year, it will be passed throughout the Province to be used at duly constituted meetings of all municipal jurisdictions and will finally occupy a place of honour in the new Provincial Museum and Archives Complex in Victoria.

His Worship also mentioned that a book will accompany the Gavel and it will be signed by the Chief MagIstrate of each municipality as a part of the ceremony.

His Worship conveyed congratulations to Councillors Herd, Corsbie and Drummond on their re-election to Council, and welcomed Councillor-Elect Lorimer on his election to Council.

He also conveyed congratulations to School Trustees Burke and Murnane on their re-election to the School Board, and Mrs. Caroline Prior on her election to the Board.

His Worship also expressed appreciation for the selfless participation of many citizens who accept appointments to various municipal bodies for the contributions which they make.

He also commended the employees of the Corporation for the service which they render to the Hadispall $\gamma_{\rm c}$

His Morship made reference to his Inaugural Address of January 3, 1966 in which he advised caution in the undertaking of capital improvements involving the use of borrowed funds. He stated that the Council, last year, effected a significant curtailment in works programmes, particularly in respect of sanitary sewer installations and Local Improvement street development as a result of the restraint which was recommended be exercised last year.

He added that the sale in recent days of an issue in the amount of one million dollars will permit a modest resumption of important works.

He also indicated that, despite the extensive postponement of certain projects, the year 1966 was one of notable growth and progress in all areas of municipal responsibility.

Wis Worship then outlined the significant accomplishments which were achieved last year, and made reference to measures which were anticipated would need to be implemented during 1967, as follows:

- (i) Street development saw the completion of the Boundary Road project, the reconstruction of Douglas Road between Boundary Road and Lougheed Highway, the reconstruction of Imperial Street between Patterson Avenue and Royal Oak Avenue, and the construction of an industrial road between Sperling Avenue and Dainbridge Avenue. Work also commenced on the widening of Willingdon Avenue North of Still Creek to Hastings Street. It is anticipated that the construction of the grade separation to eliminate the level crossing of the Great Northern Railway right-of-way at Willingdon Avenue will shortly be underway now that the cost-sharing arrangements appear to be concluded. It is hoped that the Department of Highways for the Provincial Government will proceed to widen and improve Grandview-Douglas Highway from 10th Avenue to Smith Avenue now that underground services have been provided. In addition, it is expected that the Hastings Street widening project will be accomplished shortly now that the Urban Renewal Scheme for the Hastings Street area has been approved by the Federal Government, the Provincial Government and the Hunicipality. He also made reference to the rehabilitation of North Road, mentioning in this regard that funds have been set aside by Burnaby to meet its responsibility for the work.
- (ii) During the past two years, slightly more than 100 miles of sanitary sewers were installed. With regard to storm sewers, these installations have been extensive, with the result the flooding problems which were earlier experienced in the Municipality have been greatly reduced.
- (iii) Advances have been made in extending "final standard" street-lighting, notably on Boundary and Douglas Roads, and the Royal Oak Willingdon extension. Interim lighting, employing mercury-vapour units fastened to utility poles, was also increased.

It will be recommended that more of this latter type of lighting, as well as the former, be provided for some of the busier streets in the municipality.

- (iv) The Justice Building is now under construction and will be occupied at the end of 1967.
- (v) The growth of Durnaby has made it necessary to expand the complimant of the R.C.H.P., which is the largest detachment in Comada.
- (vi) The Fire Department will need additional personnel, equipment and recommoduation, and recommendations to achieve these requirements will be forthering during the year.

- (vii) There has been an encouraging increase in commercial and industrial development.
- (viii) A review of the water utility will be undertaken to determine the adequacy of the rate structure in relation to the need for constant renewal and expansion of the water distribution system.
 - (ix) During the past several months, a study has been in progress concerning the disposal of garbage, and a recommendation in regard to the matter will be submitted to Council in a few weeks' time.
 - (x) The question of public housing occasioned the appointment of a Committee to investigate the matter. Yais Committee will continue and its terms of reference broadened to include all provisions under the National Housing Act and the question concerning landlord-tenant relationships.
 - (xi) Plans for renovation and additions to the Burnaby General Hospital were presented to Council last summer. Financial difficulties (the "tight money" situation) in respect of borrowing the amount requested by the Hospital Board, \$6,600,000,00, commanded the deferment of a submission to the electorate. A Committee of Council has been working with one from the Hospital Board with the end in mind of achieving a common goal. It would appear that the establishment of a regional district with hospitals as a function could be the logical solution to a problem which is not related to municipal boundaries. At his request, the provisional budget has been increased by two mills to cover possible expenditures in hospital accommodation.
- (xii) 1966 was the B.C. Centennial Year and the Centennial Committee was quite active in planning and sponsoring celebrations, and also in choosing and advancing the Centennial Project. It is regretted that the project originally chosen, the development of Burnaby Lake, had to be abandoned for the time being in the light of the conclusions reached as a result of the engineering study undertaken by Associated Engineering Services Limited and Swan-Wooster Engineering Limited. The purchase of the complex owned by the Universal Life Foundation was made and the Centennial Project for that property has received Provincial and Federal Governments' approval. Together with a former acquisition, this will provide an area of some 21 acres between Gilpin Street and the shores of Deer Lake. The existing buildings. with progressive renovation, will provide for a wide range of cultural and recreational activities. The Centennial Committee expects to be extremely active this year, which marks both the Canadian Centennial and Burnaby's 75th Birthday. The choice of the project is fortunate in many respects, one of them being that virtually all of the activities currently carried on at the Valleyview Community Centre can be accommodated on the Centennial Project site. This will enable the Council to use the land occupied by the present Community Centre for uses associated with the Municipal Hall. The building which is to house the theatre and assembly hall has been named "Jim Cowan Centre" in recognition of the contribution made by Mr. Cowan since 1919 in the promotion of the Valleyview Community Centre.
- (xiii) School Trustee C. J. Murnane and Parks Commissioner Doreen Lawson have been added to the Centennial Committee as representatives of the School Doard and Parks and Recreation Commission, respectively.
 - (xiv) Since the rhododendron family has been chosen as the official flower for Burnaby, it is recommended that Council request the Parks and Recreation Commission to prepare a horticultural display at the Pacific National Exhibition this year with the use of rhododendrons and athleas is order to focus attention on Burnaby's flower. This would replace the booth which the Municipality has rented at the P.W.L. Juring the past few years.

It is also proposed to send a rhododendron bu and a dogwood trea to Kushiro, Hokkaido, Japan, with Mr. G. Patcy, Centennial Co-ordinator, who will be travelling there shortly. In addition, the same will be sent to Loughborough, Leicestershire, England, where Robert Burnaby rests.

- (xv) While in Loughborough last year; he visited the grave of Robert Burnaby and, in a discussion of the Rector, arrangements were made to have the grave plot renovated and tended. This has been done and it is recommended that a grant amount of \$50.00 be made to Emmanuel Church to cover this attention.
- (xvi) The opening of the Pitch and Putt Golf Course last summer marked another advance in the development of Central Park under the joint auspices of Burnaby and Vancouver. Later this year, the Humicipal Golf Course on Burnaby Mountain will be open for play. A great deal of commendation is due the Parks and Recreation Commission for its achievements.
- (xvii) The Planning Department was extremely active during the year, producing reports on the Second Street Area Study, Revision of the North-East Burnaby Plan and the Apartment Study in addition to its normal subdivision and rezoning activities. Nuch work will be required in producing needed information for capital programming which it is hoped Council will endorse.
