Gentlemen: Re: Parade Float.

Council approved a competition for art students in the Burnaby School system for the design of the 1967 Parade Float.

Professor Samuel Black, Faculty of Education, University of British Columbia, kindly consented to judge the competition.

Estimates of the cost of producing the float from the winning designs were obtained. The estimated costs ranged from \$3,500.00 to \$7,000.00.

A meeting was held with a Committee from the Burnaby Junior Chamber of Commerce and the design submitted by William (Bill) Merret, 4222 Hazelwood Crescent, was selected. The 1966 float frame and this design can be modified to produce a very attractive parade float for the year 1967. The estimated cost is \$2,500.00.

Council authorized the purchase of a motorized float chassis at an estimated cost of \$1,500.00. The order was held pending a final decision on the design. In the event the "Merret" design is selected, the chassis approved by Council will not be required for 1967.

The Burnaby Junior Chamber of Commerce is once again willing to be responsible for the float entered in any parade in the following areas for \$100.00 for each parade:

Burnaby	Port Moody
Vancouver	Port Coquitlam
West Vancouver	Coquitlam
North Vancouver	New Westminster
	Richmond

The cost of transportation would be additional to the \$100.00 for any parades entered outside the above mentioned areas.

Two parades are being considered at this time. They are:

The Centennial Parade - July 1st.
 The P.N.E. Parade - August 19th.

The Burnaby Junior Chamber of Commerce will be responsible for:

- (a) Transportation and accommodation of individuals to ensure:
 - (i) Proper entry of the float in the various parades;
 - (ii) Manning and operating the float during parades;
- (b) Transportation, accommodation and chaperone for Miss Burnaby and attendants to and from the float.
- (c) Payment of expenses incidental to the proper presentation of the float, e.g. flowers, hair arrangements for the girls, et cetera.
- (d) Care of the float in the parade areas.

The Corporation is to be responsible for:

- (a) Producing the float.
- (b) Transportation of the float to and from the parade sites.
- (c) Maintenance.
- (d) Insurance.
- (e) Providing Motor power.


The estimated costs are as follows:

It is recommended that:

- (a) The awards be presented to the winners by the Reeve at a Council meeting.
- (b) The 1966 float and the design submitted by William Merrett be modified to produce the 1967 float.
- (c) A special award of \$50.00 be granted to William (Bill) Merrett.
- (d) The offer of the Burnaby Junior Chamber of Commerce to assist in the presentation of the float be accepted.
- (e) The estimate of \$3,500.00 be approved.
