# APRIL 30, 1969

An adjourned meeting of the Municipal Council was held in the Council Chambers, Municipal Hall, 4949 Canada Way, Burnaby 2, B. C. on Wednesday, April 30, 1969 at 3:15 p.m.

PRESENT:

ABSENT:

MOVED BY ALDERMAN MERCIER, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND: "That the Council now resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MUNICIPAL MANAGER pointed out that the Budget, as prepared, provides for a general and debt mill rate of 15.75 in comparison to 16.125 last year. He added that one mill this year will produce \$602,362.00 whereas last year it produced \$528,705.00.

He also elaborated on the items shown on the summary page of the Budget document.

ALDERMAN DAILLY ARRIVED AT THE MEETING.

Municipal Manager indicated that the amount shown in the Surplus/Contingency Account (\$398,635.00) should be sufficient to cover the costs of a wage increase to the employees if the award is not much greater than that presently being offered to them.

He stressed that the Council can either leave the sum as it is and hope that the wage increase is not much greater than that being offered at the present time, although there will be very little left in the Account to meet any special expenditures which Council may desire later in the year, or increase the amount.

ALDERMAN BLAIR ARRIVED AT THE MEETING.

ALDERMAN MCLEAN ARRIVED AT THE MEETING.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN MERCIER, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN CLARK: "That the Surplus/Contingency Account not be changed."

CARR IED

AGAINST -- ALDERMAN HERD

ALDERMAN MERCIER suggested that the Council should first determine how much it wishes to raise in the form of taxes and then establish the Budget accordingly, rather than be confronted with a series of proposed expenditures or commitments and then endeavour to fix the mill rate.

As regards the Provincial Government increase in the per capita grant, the Hunicipal Manager stated that the situation is now almost farcical and out of hand. He explained that the original per capita grant was unconditional but it is no longer.

He added that the increases the Provincial Government has made in the per capita—grant over the past few years has not produced more net revenue to the municipality because municipalities need to assume other costs which were formerly borne by the Provincial Government.

He mentioned that he had received a letter from the Department of Finance regarding the increase in the per capita grant indicating that it was first to be applied toward the provision of ambulance service.

MUNICIPAL MANAGER advised that Social Allowances are now paid on an 80/20 basis with the Provincial Government but this does not include administration costs, the result of this being that the municipality is really paying approximately 40% of the total costs of operating a welfare programme.

ALDERMAN CLARK LEFT THE MEETING.

MOVED BY ALDERHAN MERCIER, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN HERD: "That the 1969 Budget, as submitted, be approved."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY ALDERMAN BLAIR, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DRUMMOND: "That the Committee now rise and report,"

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

THE COUNCIL RECONVENED.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN BLAIR, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN McLEAN: 'That the report of the Committee be now adopted."

ALCERMAN MERCIER read a report he had received from the Treasurer in connection with this matter.

ALDERMAN DRUMMOND LEFT THE MEETING.

MOVED BY ALDERMAN MERCIER, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DAILLY:
"That the remaining \$650,000.00 in the "Lane Paving" part of the
Capital Improvement Programme be deleted and this amount plus the
\$50,000.00 which Council on April 23rd directed be placed in a
Contingency Reserve be re-entered under a heading "Roads" in a
Contingency Fund."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

MOVED BY ALDERMAN MERCIER, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN McLEAN: "That the figures under "Vehicles and Equipment (other than Parks, Fire and Library)" for the years 1970 to 1972 be:
