REPORT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Woman and Girls Swim has been popular with the Burnaby community and there has been strong support for this activity, including a delegation appearance at the 2022 May 10 Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission meeting. The closure of C.G. Brown Memorial Pool on 2022 October 31, necessitates an alternative site be identified for continuation of the program,

To identify a new location the following was undertaken; participants were surveyed, facility schedules were analyzed, physical layouts were scrutinized and geographical locations were reviewed. After taking into consideration all of these factors, Bonsor Pool has been determined as the most suitable location to ensure the success of the programs continuation.

The Survey attracted 129 responses over a two-week period from 2022 August 4 – 18. With the results and comments gathered, and considering the existing Learn to Swim programs, public swims, and allotments scheduled at Bonsor Pool, the Women

and Girls Swim new schedule will be on Mondays from 7:30 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. starting 2022 November 7.

Bonsor Pool is located in the community hub of Metrotown and is easily accessible by transit, including Skytrain.

The weight room at C.G. Brown Memorial Pool was not well attended during the Women and Girls Swim. Due to the layout at Bonsor Recreation Centre, the weight room will not be included as part of this program.

The change in program time and location will be promoted:

- directly to those who attend the current swim;
- through the City's social media channels;
- on the City's web page; and,
- by direct email to existing participants.

Program participation will be closely monitored and any changes required will be communicated in the same manner as above.

2.0 POLICY SECTION

The Women and Girls Swim is aligned with the following policies and plans adopted by Council: Corporate Strategic Plan (2022), Social Sustainability Strategy (2011).

The City of Burnaby, embraces diversity, belonging and participation. Women and girls face multiple barriers to recreation participation. Providing specific swim times for women and girls has been shown to increase their physical activity overall and build confidence and comfort for participation in other pursuits. This program ensures that everyone has access to aquatic leisure activities, and assists in ensuring that Burnaby is a barrier free community.

3.0 BACKGROUND

The Women and Girls Swim started in the fall of 2013 in partnership with the City of New Westminster. It offers a safe and inviting environment for women and girls of all ages and swimming abilities to socialize, exercise, and benefit from an aquatic environment without barriers. The program has been scheduled at C.G. Brown Memorial Pool on Sundays from 4:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m.

After 60 years of service to the community, C.G. Brown Memorial Pool has reached its end of life. The last day of operation on 2022 October 31 is leading to the start of construction for the new Burnaby Lake Aquatic and Arena Facilities.
