3.0 CITIZEN SUPPORT SERVICES 2021 ANNUAL REPORT

Citizen Support Services 2021 Annual Report is attached for Councils information. (See Attachment - 1).

Some highlights from Citizen Support Services 2021 Annual Report are as follows:

- Delivery of frozen meals to vulnerable seniors during COVID With the grant funding from United Way, the Canadian Medical Association and Burnaby City Council redirecting a percentage of their yearly remuneration, the Citizen Support Services and the City's Food Services were able to provide and deliver a total of 23,842 meals to vulnerable seniors throughout the pandemic. Over 7,000 were delivered between January - May 2021 alone;
- Shop by Phone Grocery Service Volunteers and staff shopped and delivered over \$222,000 worth of groceries to housebound seniors;
- Better at Home Program Staff, through contractors, provided Burnaby seniors with 3,915 housekeeping services and 65 rides to medical appointments.

4.0 SUPPORT DURING COVID-19

For Councils information, staff have taken the following actions to additionally support seniors and other clients serviced through existing programs:

- Increased intake of clients;
- Increased the number of grocery orders shopped and delivered to assist house bound seniors during COVID;
- Enhanced our Phone Buddy program to respond to growing isolation felt by seniors during COVID;
- Delivered over 1000 student letters to seniors throughout the year in their grocery bags and meal delivery bags (Citizen Support partnered with the IAK Foundation and Burnaby Schools for this initiative);
- Distributed approximately 4,000 Christmas cards and crafts to seniors in Assisted Living and Residential Care Facilities as well as the seniors that we serve (Citizen Support partnered with the IAK Foundation and Burnaby Schools for this initiative);
- Sourced sponsorship funding and delivered over 100 Christmas baskets to housebound seniors.

5.0 CONCLUSION

Citizen Support Services with its volunteers and staff have continued to support seniors and other clients through its programs. Throughout the pandemic, staff have also further enhanced services and adapted programs to better support some of the most vulnerable citizens during this period.
