Burnaby Take a Hike Program

An application was received from the Take a Hike Youth at Risk Foundation requesting a grant for their Take a Hike Program from 2022 July 01 – 2023 June 30 at the Canada Way Learning Centre. The no-cost, volunteer-based, full-time mental health and emotional well-being program engages vulnerable youth (ages 15 to 18) in schools, community and mental health supports. Youth are referred to the program by the School District, and are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

The coordinator collaborates with partnering agencies regarding planning and delivery of programs, services, activities and educational support.

The North and South Burnaby Neighbourhood Houses provide access to programs and supports addressing diverse barriers faced by individuals and families in the community. In addition, residents benefit from programs such as the food hub operated at the BNH Community Hall and families benefit from the care offered at the 9 daycare sites.

Community Engagement Programs

An application was received from the Burnaby Neighbourhood House Society requesting a grant for the staff coordination and promotion of their Community Engagement Programs and activities. This program aims to engage residents as volunteers to provide accessible and inclusive programming for the community. This includes a range of free to low cost programs (e.g. English conversational classes, monthly community dinners, free income tax clinics, yoga classes, tai chi, line dancing, art workshops, cooking demonstrations, book clubs and knitting circles) and for the volunteers, an opportunity to share their talents/skills and increase connections in their community. Approximately 8,000 residents per year benefit from this program.

In 2021, over 15,822 meals to 198 clients were provided, with 53 volunteers that gave a total of 3,033 hours.
