REPORT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to update the Committee and Council of the new timeline for the 2023 Local Hero and Kushiro Cup Awards. The report outlines the existing process for each award and how the two awards could be streamlined into one process.

2.0 POLICY CONTEXT

The Burnaby Local Hero and the Kushiro Cup Awards align with and are supported by the following Council-adopted policies and plans/strategies: *Equity Policy* (2020), *Corporate Strategic Plan* (2022) and the *Social Sustainability Strategy* (2011).

3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1 Kushiro Cup, Outstanding Citizen of the Year and Eligibility

Each year, the City presents the Kushiro Cup to its Outstanding Citizen of the Year. The cup was presented to the City of Burnaby by its Sister City, Kushiro, Japan, in 1982¹. To date, the City has recognized 40 Kushiro Cup recipients that are from diverse backgrounds but share the common values of leadership, service and community².

As stated in the eligibility guidelines established by Council, one individual may be selected each year. The award is to recognize and celebrate individuals for their contribution to culture, recreation and other non-elected civic activities through volunteering their time and energy over the years. The recipient must have volunteered in several community programs in Burnaby for at least 10 years and have positively influenced the community and the lives of its citizens. The Kushiro Cup Award process typically begins in January of each calendar year.

3.2 Local Hero Award and Eligibility

Since 1997, Burnaby has identified and recognized Local Heroes, individuals who make outstanding contributions to community well-being in Burnaby. To date, the City has recognized 275 Local Heroes, individuals who represent diverse interests and backgrounds and have contributed to the community in a variety of ways (see list of past recipients in *Appendix 1*, *attached*).

As stated in the eligibility guidelines established by the Social Planning Committee in 2010, a maximum of 12 Local Heroes may be selected each year. The awards are intended to recognize individuals who have made contributions to community well-being in Burnaby through volunteer activities for at least five years and in a minimum of two different activities. Local Hero Awards are given on a one-time basis only.

In 2018, Council requested that the Local Hero Award nomination be held every two years to increase the number of awardees being celebrated at the award ceremonies. The recent Local Hero Awards reflected this in 2019 and 2021. The Local Hero Award process typically begins in May of each calendar year.

¹ In the fall of 1982, Professor Takayoshi Makino, head of the Languages Department of the University of Hokkaido, accompanied 16 students from his English class to British Columbia for a five-day "Canadian Experience." Professor Makino brought with him a trophy from Mayor Wanibuchi of Kushiro. Makino gave the trophy to Mayor Bill Lewarne, which has since been used each year to honour the contributions of our outstanding citizens. A similar cup is awarded annually in Kushiro and is called the Burnaby Cum

4.0 2023 COMBINED AWARDS PROCESS UPDATE

4.1 Updated Timeline

The Local Hero Award and the Kushiro Cup Award nomination process was integrated for 2023, launching on 2023 January 16. This year's nominations will close on 2023 February 17. Staff will then review the submissions in accordance with the established eligibility guidelines for each award and provide a report to the Committee that will include the proposed nominees for each award for consideration.

4.2 Rationale for Combining the Award Processes

As staff have undertaken the processes for the awards over time, areas for improvement have been identified, considering staff time and resourcing required for hosting both awards.

Number of Nominations Received

The number of nominations received had decreased in both award categories over time. Staff identified that the nominations were commonly received for both awards due to the similarity in the eligibility criteria. For example, if a candidate was not selected as the Kushiro Cup recipient, the same candidate would commonly apply to the Local Hero Award hosted later in the year. By combining the award process, the intent is to increase the number and quality of nominations.

Cost Effectiveness

Each award includes a funding request for printing and advertising costs from the Boards, Committees and Commissions budget. These costs include advertisements in the local newspaper (e.g. Burnaby Now), the City's social media channels (e.g. City Facebook page and Twitter account, including paid social media advertisements), and printing.

In addition, staff collect the nominations, review the submissions for adherence to established criteria and provide reports outlining the nominees for the awards. Once considered, the successful recipients are invited to receive the award at a ceremony where food, photos and a small gift of appreciation are provided. The Local Hero Award is hosted at a Council meeting and the Kushiro Cup Award is a dinner organized at the Shadbolt Centre.

By combining the award process, the intent is to combine printing and advertisement costs as well as any other associated costs, including staff time to review and prepare reports and organize ceremonies. Future consideration could be given to honour and celebrate both award categories at a single event.

5.0 CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Local Hero Award and Kushiro Cup Award represent and reflect the dedicated efforts of volunteers and their contributions to community leadership and well-being in Burnaby. Integrating the nomination, selection and celebration process for both awards is intended to increase the
