

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT the Committee recommend Council approve a contribution of \$10,000 to Squamish Nation to support the marking of the 100th anniversary of the Squamish Nation Amalgamation.

## **REPORT**

## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The City of Burnaby has made significant efforts towards implementing the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (TRC) 'Call to Action' for local governments.

In the spirit of continuing with these efforts, the Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation Division seeks to advance reconciliation and to further build positive and meaningful relationships with host First Nations through the recognition and acknowledgment of the history of colonialism and its impacts on the First Nations whose territory the City of Burnaby is now located.

## 2.0 **BACKGROUND**

The traditional territory of the Skwxwú7mesh people covers over 6,700 square kilometres from what is now referred to as Burrard Inlet to Howe Sound. When the Indian Act was passed in 1876, the B.C. government imposed a restrictive system of reserves, and the Skwxwú7mesh people were grouped into 16 Indian bands<sup>1</sup>.

The creation of reserves had a significant impact on Skwxwú7mesh culture and traditional ways of living. They were further impacted by continued settler demand for real estate, which continued to forcibly displace them in their homelands. These unfair and discriminatory practices on behalf of the colonial government, led to the idea of amalgamation. Amalgamation would allow the Skwxwú7mesh Indian bands to unite their assets and governance. Their proposal to Indian Affairs

was approved on July 23, 1923. On that date, the 16 Indian bands, with a combined population of 412 members, were united as the Squamish Nation. Today, the Squamish Nation has more than 3,600 members.

# 3.0 PROPOSED CONTRIBUTION

This year marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Squamish Nation Amalgamation and the founding of the modern Squamish Nation. In celebration of this 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Squamish Nation will spend the month of July hosting over 30 events for their community members and the general public. Events will range from smaller group activities, such as healing ceremonies and guided tours of Squamish Territory, to larger scale performances such as a Squamish Nation Excellence Gala and an Amalgamation Day festival and concert.

In an effort to honour this historic moment, support reconciliation and further develop an encouraging relationship with Squamish Nation, the Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation Division recommends the City of Burnaby contribute the amount of \$10,000 for the 2023 Skwxwú7mesh Days Festival, which will celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Squamish Nation Amalgamation.

This contribution will be recognized by including the City's official logo on the event webpage and onsite sponsor signage.

## 4.0 RECOMMENDATION

It is requested that the Executive Committee of Council recommend Council approve the contribution of \$10,000 to Squamish Nation for the 2023 Skwxwú7mesh Days Festival, to celebrate the marking of the 100th anniversary of the Squamish Nation Amalgamation.

In 1923, sixteen Skwxwú7mesh communities that were then Indian Bands joined together and amalgamated to become the Squamish Nation, or Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw. July 2023 marks the 100th anniversary of Amalgamation and presents a unique opportunity to celebrate the Nation's history, unity and success.

# **Background**

We are the Skwxwú7mesh – descendants of the original Skwxwú7mesh - speaking villages throughout the watersheds of the Squamish River, Mamquam River, Howe Sound, English Bay, False Creek, and Burrard Inlet. Our people's history spans many millennia of living and governing our territory. The oldest known Skwxwú7mesh archaeological site in the territory is 8,600 years old at Porteau Cove in the Howe Sound.

In 1923, several Skwxwú7mesh communities that were then Indian Bands joined together and amalgamated to become the Squamish Nation, or Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw. This year marks our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary since the

approval of the Squamish Nation Amalgamation on July 23rd, 1923, and the founding of the modern Squamish Nation!

Today, the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw is one of the largest First Nations in British Columbia with over 4,000 members. About half of the members live on one of the nine on-reserve communities stretching from Vancouver to the Squamish while the other half of the members live off-reserve in Metro Vancouver, Squamish, Whistler, and beyond.

Today, the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw is governed by the Squamish Nation Council, or Nexwsxwníwntm ta Úxwumixw, which is elected for a four-year term and oversees the administration and finances of the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw and associated entities. The mission of the Council is to protect the Amalgamation and enhance the Úxwumixw values and traditions through respect, equality, and harmony for all.

With about 500 employees (70% Indigenous), the administration has four main divisions: People Services, Territory & Culture, Corporate Services, and Community Services. Each division is led by an Executive Director reporting to the Chief Administrative Officer. The administration is responsible for delivering the ambitious goals of the Nation as set-out in the Squamish Nation Strategic Plan 2022-2026. Our vision is for the Nation to lift each other up with Skwxwú7mesh care, values, and ways of knowing.

Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw is also one of the three First Nation partners (along with our relatives the Tsleil-Waututh First Nation and the Musqueam Indian Band) that make up the MST Development Corporation. Named #1 in Vancouver Magazine's "Power 50 for 2022", Squamish Nation (along with our MST partners) will be reshaping the face of Vancouver for decades to come.

It is an exciting time for Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw. The future is one of growth, ambition, and opportunity. With a variety of projects and initiatives underway – including the development of the Seńákw lands which will create 6000 housing units in the heart of Kitsilano – the Nation is poised to have a major influence throughout its ancestral lands from Vancouver and Squamish to Whistler.
