#### COMMITTEE TO COUNCIL REPORT

**FROM:** EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF COUNCIL

SUBJECT: COMMUNITY GRANT APPLICATIONS (23.47.0, 23.49.0-23.51.0)

**PURPOSE:** To seek Council approval of Community Grant applications received in

August 2023.

#### RECOMMENDATION

**THAT** the following Operating Grant applications received in August 2023, be approved as follows:

- 23.47.O The Society to End Homelessness \$10,000;
- 23.49.0 Vancouver Chinese Film Association \$4,000;
- 23.50.O Burnaby Family Life Institute \$20,000; and
- 23.51.O Maple Leaf Singers \$2,000.

#### 1.0 POLICY SECTION

The provision of community grants is aligned with the following Council-adopted policies, plans, and strategies: *Burnaby Economic Development Strategy* (2007); *Social Sustainability Strategy* (2011), and the *Corporate Strategic Plan* (2017) that identifies the importance of a sense of belonging, inclusion, and high quality of life.

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND

The Executive Committee of Council, at its Open meeting held on September 6, 2023, received a staff report outlining Community Grant applications received in August 2023 and adopted the recommendations as noted above. This report seeks Council approval of the Community Grants as recommended.

#### 2.1 Operating Grant

An operating grant may be requested for the purpose of offsetting operating costs including salaries, lease or rent payments, utilities, insurance, office supplies and maintenance & repairs. A maximum of one (1) operating grant per year per organization, with a maximum of 25% of the organizations' annual budget to a maximum grant of \$10,000 can be provided to eligible organizations.

#### 2.2 Program Grant

Program grants may be requested for the purpose of funding projects, events, and or programs, such as outreach initiatives, block parties, environmental and other community events that benefit Burnaby residents. In-kind services from the City may also be granted under this category. A maximum of two (2) program grants are allowed per year.

#### 2.3 Recreational Sport Grant

Recreational Sport Grants may be requested by scheduled users of the Parks, Recreation and Culture facilities or representatives of Burnaby School District #41. The grant is available for Burnaby residents under the age of 21, competing in a championship tournament outside of the Lower Mainland. The contributions are as follows:

Provincial \$175 per person to a maximum of \$1,750 per team National \$250 per person to a maximum of \$2,500 per team International \$300 per person to a maximum of \$3,000 per team

#### 3.1 COMMUNITY GRANT APPLICATIONS IN AUGUST

# 23.47.0 The Society to End Homelessness Operating Grant – Attachment 1

#### Grant History:

New Applicant

An application was received from The Society to End Homelessness in Burnaby for an operating grant to offset the operational costs associated with running three (3) Outreach Resource Centres throughout Burnaby. These centres are located at the Neighbourhood Church (Edmonds/Kingsway area), at Jubilee near Bonsor/Metrotown and off North Road near Lougheed. In addition, the Society runs a mobile shower unit and a Food Hub at the Neighbourhood Church. Funds will be used for salaries, utilities, insurance, office supplies and honoraria. In 2022 the Society helped 6,430 Outreach Resource Centre guests, served 11,730 hot lunches, distributed 7,980 packaged food hub bags that created 17,999 meals.

# 23.49.0 Vancouver Chinese Film Festival Request: \$10,000 Operating Grant - Attachment 2

#### Grant History:

An application was received from Vancouver Chinese Film Association in Burnaby for an operating grant to offset the operational costs such as compensation for the performers, technicians and labourers, theatre rental, and materials for the red-carpet event on September 17<sup>th</sup> at Michael J. Fox Theatre. This is the 11<sup>th</sup> year of the Vancouver Chinese Film Festival which took a two-year hiatus during the pandemic. The festival celebrates and embraces Chinese

culture. Approximately 1,000 Burnaby residents attend and are involved in the one-day event.

# 23.50.0 Burnaby Family Life Institute Request: \$20,000 Operating Grant - Attachment 3

#### Grant History:

An application was received from Burnaby Family Life Institute for an operating grant to offset the operational costs incurred across their 9 Burnaby locations. Burnaby Family Life provides childcare in six licensed centres, parenting support classes, individual support groups, family drop-in programs, pregnancy outreach programs and family life education programs. The organization serves approximately 3,000 clients a year providing programs and services, employment, and volunteer opportunities.

# 23.51.0 The Maple Leaf Singers Operating Grant - Attachment 4

#### Grant History:

New Applicant

An application was received from Maple Leaf Singers for an operating grant to offset operational costs such as storage of equipment, equipment maintenance, transportation, conductor and accompanist fees, and rehearsal venue rental. Currently rehearsing at Jubilee United Church in Burnaby, the Maple Leaf Singer members come from various cities with a large percentage from Burnaby. Annual performances at Lougheed Mall for Christmas are a highlight. In addition, Maple Leaf Singers performed at Walk for the Cure at Central Park and have previously put on shows at Bonsor Community Centre, Courtyard Terrace, Gilmore Place, Derby Manor and Carlton Villa. The funds would be used for the fiscal year from August 1, 2023 to July 31, 2024.

Successful applicants of the Community Grant program must acknowledge the City's financial assistance on all the program's communications and promotional materials, including brochures, posters, advertisements, websites, news releases, signs, etc.

#### GOAL 1

Provision of Services: to assist individuals who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless by operating and maintaining programs and facilities to enable such persons to obtain shelter, services, support and necessities to address their basic needs.

Continue our ORCs in the current 3 locations as well as the establishment of 1 new centre with services provided

#### DESCRIPTION

We have implemented and are maintaining a portable Shower Program for our ORC guests. It is the only such unit in the Lower Mainland. We are taking the unit to various community events to promote the program and create awareness.

We have implemented a 3rd location for a pop-up in the Lougheed area and are maintaining our existing 2 locations at the Neighbourhood Church and on Jubilee near Bonsor/Metrotown. Number of patrons has grown in both locations. We are continually working on increasing the services offered at our main ORC on Thursday mornings, ie working on getting a mental health nurse to attend.

#### GOAL 2

Awareness and Community Engagement - to bring awareness to the issues of homelessness and to our involvement in serving those in need of housing and services to address homelessness in Burnaby. Our desire is to invite and invvolve member of the community to join in supporting the cause through finances, participation and encouragement

#### DESCRIPTION

one of our objectives is to grow the Society's membership to 100

the 2nd objective is to have the resources to educate various neighbourhoods/organizations about homelessness - we have and are doing this through community presentations ie in schools, churches, other interested groups. We are organising Coldest Night of the Year (7th annual in 2023), which is a fundraising walk, but also draws a lot of awareness to the issues and challenges of living with precarious or without housing.

#### GOAL 3

Pursuing Adequate, Affordable Housing - to work towards the privision of housing for Burnaby residents who are without or are at risk of homelessness in Burnaby. To work towards the prevention of future homelessness in Burnaby.

- to work towards the provision of 200 new affordable housing units
- to add a permanent shelter, continue the temporary shelters and extreme heat, centre, and to start a temporary shelter in North Burnaby as well as add a winter shelter

#### DESCRIPTION

- The Taskforce to End Homelessness in Burnaby has established a subgroup that's working on 2 permanent 24/7 shelter, one in the North/East part of Burnaby and one on the Southside of Burnaby.
- we are in ongoing talks with the City and service providers to ensure that temporary shelters are continued and/or alternate locations are being provided, that the extreme heat centre is going to be continued as well as winter shelters are being offered.

Over the past two years, BFL has changed the way many of our programs operate, with an increased reliance on technology to better connect with our clients and extend our reach of service. Additionally, there have been modifications to our operations requiring an increase in administrative support to ensure seamless services within the organization that extends beyond current funding structures. BFL proudly offers services and programs that meet the emerging needs of the community, and these funds will help not only support our current clients, but also help us continue reaching the larger Burnaby community.

The general operating grant funds will be used within our 2023-2024 fiscal year in various ways to offset costs incurred. BFL offers year-round programming six days a week during the morning, afternoon, and evening. The funds will be used to support the increased administrative costs required in:

- Maintaining new online registration platforms for programming
- Continual updates on our website and social media to reflect increased programming options and to better reach the Burnaby community
- Increased insurances required for extending programming into accessible community spaces
- Staffing costs related to bringing in additional administrative support

Every one of our programs has had to adapt to Burnaby's changing demographics. We have worked very hard, for many years, to hire a staff team that represent the cultural diversity of Burnaby. Collectively our staff speak more than 39 different languages and we have adapted programing to reflect the municipality's cultural diversity.

In our delivery of programs and services, we have developed programing that recognizes the cultural diversity of our families and the community. We understand that it is more than celebrating holidays from various cultures but understanding them and integrating them into our everyday activities. Our staff often support newcomers, both individuals and parents adjusting to the parenting expectations and norms here in Canada particularly when they significantly differ from the family's country of origin.

Through the programs that we provide, the relationships made, and the tools learned continue into the community of Burnaby. They lead individuals to further integration into their community and to actively engage in their community.
