PURPOSE: To seek Council approval of the Festival Burnaby Grant applications received.

An application request for \$15,000 eligible amount has been received from the Philippine Cultural Heritage Society for their Philippine Cultural Heritage Festival on August 26, 2023 at Swangard Stadium. The festival attracts between 2,000 and 4,000 visitors.

The Philippine Cultural Heritage Festival is a celebration of the Philippine Culture and heritage featuring cultural dances, food, music and arts. The free of charge, family oriented event will encourage community participation, promote community spirit and camaraderie between Burnaby's diverse communities. The festival will host programs and activities with the intent to create opportunities for positive interactions between cultural, religious and ethnic communities. Grant funds are requested to support: venue/equipment rental, insurance, posters, flyers and banners. Other revenues are pending from corporate and business sponsors and vendor fees.

The Philippine Cultural Heritage Society has organized this festival for a number of years. They involve volunteers and community partners for their festival. The society's main purpose is to organize this festival.

An application request for \$25,000 eligible amount has been received from Nikkei National Museum & Cultural Centre (NNMCC) for their 11th Annual Nikkei Matsuri Family Festival on September 2-3, 2023 at the Nikkei National Museum & Cultural Centre. The festival has grown over the years and attracts approximately 10,000 people each year.

This festival is a two-day celebration of Japanese culture promoting multiculturalism that is open to the public and free of charge. The community will come together and celebrate with family-friendly events and entertainment, local arts and heritage performers, children's game zone, Japanese food from an array of vendors, beer-garden, talent show, craft artisans and cultural displays. The NNMCC has professional staff to implement the festival with the support of volunteers.

They are partnering with several organizations in Burnaby including the volunteer Auxiliary Committee, an active group of around 100 seniors, the Gladstone Japanese Language School, the Centre's students in many disciplines and the Greater Vancouver Japanese Canadian Citizens Association on festival programming. Other revenue includes pending support from Federal and Provincial governments, local businesses including media (Global TV, Nikkei TV, Shinpo Japanese newspaper, Japanese Bulletin, Richmond News, Vancouver Sun), individual donors and earned revenue from vendor fees, games and sales. Grant funds are requested to support eligible expenses including artists/performers fees, equipment rental, public safety, administration and volunteer expenses.

Since September 2000, NNMCC has provided the public with cultural, educational and recreational programs. It is a meeting place with a proximity to the Highland Park Line Trail and the Edmonds skytrain station that allows residents and visitors to regularly utilize the Centre's traditional Japanese garden as a place of repose, in addition to offering cultural, educational, and recreational programs.

An application request for \$15,000 eligible amount has been received from Multicultural Drum Festival Society for their inaugural Burnaby Multicultural Drum Festival on July 8, 2023, taking place at the Brentwood Mall Plaza. The event will draw approximately 3,000 people.

The Multicultural Drum Festival is a one-day free celebration of cultural diversity through music, specifically drums that is common in many cultures and traditions. Twenty teams from ten ethnic backgrounds will come together and have a multicultural dialogue and exchange through drums. In addition, there will be a special appearance by an international team. The Multicultural Drum Festival highlights the spirit of multiculturalism and acts as a platform for local artists to showcase their talent and art. They intend to welcome a diverse audience from Burnaby and the Greater Vancouver area at the festival and Brentwood Mall location. Grant funds are requested to support eligible expenses: artists/performers fees, venue/equipment rental, administration, and marketing/ promotions. Other revenues are pending from sponsors.

The Multicultural Drum Society is a newly formed society in 2020 for the sole purpose of organizing this festival. The planning committee is made up of prominent community leaders with different ethnic background. As it is a new organization and first time producing the festival, additional details are not available.

An application request for \$25,000 eligible amount has been received from the Shri Guru Ravidass Sabha (Vancouver) for their Nagar Kirtan Community Parade on July 22, 2023 at 7271 Gilley Avenue in Burnaby. They anticipate approximately 5,000 people to attend.

The event celebrates the teachings and birthday of Shri Guru Ravidas Ji and includes a parade with floats through the neighbourhood, hymns and music, food and presentation of key teachings of the Guru and Punjabi Indian Culture. The free of charge festival is dedicated to spreading the message of inclusivity, diversity, uplifting those in need and charity through volunteer work and donations. It will attract members of their organization as well as neighbours and other communities in Burnaby. Grant funds are requested to support public safety, artists/performers fees, venue/equipment rental, administration and marketing/promotions. Other revenues are pending from donations and sponsorships.

The Shri Guru Ravidass Sabha (Vancouver) is a non-profit organization serving the community in Burnaby since 1982. They provide social, educational and recreational activities for the community while also serving as a hub and place of worship.

An application request for \$15,000 eligible amount has been received from the UniverCity Community Association of British Columbia for their 5th Annual SFU StreetFest @ UniverCity 2023 on September 15, 2023 at University High Street, Burnaby Mountain. The annual special event draws approximately 4,000 people.

The annual SFU StreetFest @ UniverCity is an all-ages, free of charge street festival with performers, art and culture, artisan kiosks, food trucks and activities to bring the community together and to celebrate the start of Fall on Burnaby Mountain. UniverCity residents, Simon Fraser University and Fraser International College students, faculty and staff, University High Street merchants and others are anxious to reconnect after the summer break. It is a community collaboration between the UniverCity Community Association, SFU Community Trust, Simon Fraser University, Fraser International College, University Highlands Elementary School, the SFU Childcare Society, merchants and others. Grant funds are requested to support venue/equipment rental such as tents, portable toilets, stage and set up/tear down. Other revenues are pending from the Provincial government, SFU and business sponsors and vendor fees.

The Association is a volunteer-run organization, founded in 2002 to advocate for the interests of the UniverCity community, keeping residents informed, connecting people with each other through hosting events, Town halls, community Cleanup Days and more.

An application request for \$12,000 eligible amount has been received from the Bulgarian Canadian Society of British Columbia for Kanatitza Festival to be held on September 22-24, 2023. The festival aims to showcase the cultural heritage of the Bulgarian community. The family oriented, three-day festival will feature a concert at Michael J Fox Theatre, traditional needlework exhibition, ethnic cuisine, Bulgarian rose planting, parade, movie screenings and children's activities. Attendance is estimated at 300 people.

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Numerous folklore groups around North America will be invited to participate in this open and inclusive event (free admission). The festival name "Kanatitza" represents family/village and peace and unity. Grant funds are requested to support eligible expenses including artists/performers fees, venue/equipment rental, costumes, exhibits, marketing/promotions and administration. Other revenues are pending from fundraising activities and business sponsors. The Bulgarian government has confirmed its funding for this special event.

The Bulgarian-Canadian Society of British Columbia was established in 2002 and is a community driven organization dedicated to preserving and promoting Bulgarian heritage and culture. The Society organizes many festivals, concerts and exhibits of visiting and local artists.

An application request for \$12,000 eligible amount has been received from the Huaren Choir of Vancouver Society for their 7th Mid-Autumn Festival Concert to be held on September 17, 2023 at the Michael J Fox Theatre. The Mid-Autumn Festival is the second biggest Chinese traditional festival that brings people together through harmony and happiness of music and dance. The Society's special event will feature instrumental music, dance, solo and chorus performances and other programs, which is expected to attract approximately 600 people.

The Society has been organising the Mid-Autumn Festival since 2013. They have formed several community partnerships for performances and sponsorship, such as the Columbia Music Dance School, Vancouver Chinese Film Festival and BC Chinese Music Association and many others. Grant funds will support artists/performers fees, venue/equipment rental, publicity/promotions and administration. Other revenues are pending from fundraising activities, business sponsors and low cost ticket sales.

The Huaren Choir of Vancouver Society was founded in 2012 to develop and improve the level of chorus and enrich the cultural life of the community.

4.0 COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

All individuals and organizations receiving funding from the Burnaby Festivals Grant Program must acknowledge the support in all promotional materials with the Festivals Burnaby Grant Program logo.

5.0 FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The City's annual Festivals Grant budget for 2023 is \$250,000 and is funded through the gaming reserve. The following table provides a financial summary of the grant program to date. There is sufficient funding available should all eligible requests included in this report be approved by the Committee and Council.

PROJECT PROPOSAL: BURNABY FILIPINO FOOD AND MUSIC FESTIVAL

OVERVIEW

The Burnaby Filipino Cultural Society is pleased to submit this Project Proposal for consideration by the City of Burnaby and The Honourable Council as a first step towards having the City of Burnaby have its own enhanced version of the 'Richmond Night Market' or the 'North Vancouver Shipyard's Night Market' through a smaller project targeting the Filipino Community prior to expansion.

Objectives

- Create an avenue for Filipinos residing in Burnaby to showcase our culture through Food and Music.
- Initiate an immersion opportunity for residents of the City of Burnaby without the need for travel to another country.
- Strengthen partnerships built to eventually have Burnaby as the premier Festival Venue for the lower mainland.

Opportunities

- Goal #1: Introduce city residents to larger Filipino festivals for eventual expansion.
- Goal #2: Showcase the City's enhanced support for hosting large festivals.
- Goal #3: Contribute to making Burnaby the premier destination for festivals in the Lower Mainland.

OUR PROPOSAL

The Burnaby Filipino Cultural Society is composed of enthusiastic and young Filipinos whose mission is to cultivate and promote Filipino Culture in the city of Burnaby. We are backed by multifaceted experience from various disciplines and have forged alliances and memberships with established Events Organizers, Producers, Talents, Vendors, and Media Outlets. Having participated actively in producing multiple festivals outside the City of Burnaby, we have found that there is an opportunity for the city to have its own Filipino Food and Music Festival that is more organized – with more vendors and more cultural talent – from its current slate of activities.

Rationale

- Research: 63% of Burnaby Residents are from Visible Minorities, and the Filipino Diaspora is the 8th largest ethnicity in the City of Burnaby.
- There is an opportunity for improved success and expansion of previously completed Filipino Festivals in the City of Burnaby.
- As the Geographic Center of the Lower Mainland, Burnaby has a unique opportunity to be the center of Festivals and Multicultural displays.

Execution Strategy

We have formed multiple partnerships, most specially with the Reyfort Filipino Media Group (the largest and longest-running Filipino Media and Production outlet in BC) and it's conglomerate branches. We are allied with multiple Filipino-interest groups in the Lower Mainland and have confirmed desire for a large-scale event of this nature.

Funding Requirements

Funding from the City of Burnaby would greatly bolster making the proposed project the most successful exposition of Filipino Culture in the lower mainland.

City Funding will be used to partially defray projected cost of production, equipment and venue requirements, and talent expense – with the rest of funding requirements coming from fund raising, private sponsorship, and vendor contributions.

Project Deliverables

Following is a complete list of all project deliverables:

Deliverable	Description
Onboard at least 20 Filipino Food vendors.	Previous Filipino Festivals and Productions had limited space for Filipino Food vendors outside of established businesses. We are going to provide smaller Filipino businesses an opportunity to showcase their craft.
Sign at least 5 Filipino bands for nightly concerts and have the Santacruzan as one of the event highlights.	The Filipino is more than a vocal belter and can perform more than ballads. We are going to introduce Burnaby to true Filipino OPM (Original Filipino Music) and it's roots in Pinoy Rock, without alienating elderly residents through a showcase of Traditional Filipino Pageantry like the Santacruzan.
Reach 2,000 attendees.	Of the estimated 14,000 Filipinos living in Burnaby– our goal is to have close to 15% in attendance for this first run.

The project's success will be measured by meeting, if not exceeding, the three critical KPIs listed above.

Introduction

Nikkei National Museum & Cultural Centre (NNMCC) is requesting funding for a Large Scale Festival for our <u>Nikkei Matsuri Family Festival</u>, to be held on Saturday, September 2, 2023 and Sunday, September 3, 2023. On the 11th anniversary of this Japanese Fall *matsuri* Festival, the community will celebrate with family-friendly events and entertainment, local art and heritage performers, children's games, delicious food from an array of Japanese themed vendors, cultural displays, and family-friendly activities. The festival will once again reach out to the many varied cultures of our community to join and celebrate together the strength, unity, and accomplishments of our unique and diverse city. **This year's festival will partner with a new country to promote multiculturalism.**

Why is Funding Needed

NNMCC is a non-profit registered charity that relies on memberships, donations, grants, and sponsorships to help us run our varied programs and events. The Nikkei Matsuri is our largest accessible and inclusive cultural event that engages the broader local community, giving festival goers a chance to experience Japanese culture right in the **heart of Burnaby**. Funding helps us to cover performer & programming costs, operational costs, and marketing costs to put on a memorable community festival which celebrates local artists and cultural diversity. Support from community partners is essential to meet the expectations of our Burnaby community and continue this successful event.

Target Audience

The 2023 <u>Nikkei Matsuri Family Festival</u> will appeal to all age groups and cultures with an emphasis on families and children. Followed by an official opening by the Japanese Consul General and the Mayor of Burnaby Mike Hurley, and will feature traditional *odori* dance (circle folk dancing), music performances, and more. This year we will promote multiculturalism by engaging a partner country. The partner's involvement will include performances and diverse food vendors. We will be bringing back the Nikkei Talent Search this year. Event visitors will be able to view the new exhibit, Where Songs Surface, an exhibit featuring photographic medium to connect time, place, and memory. 

Project Summary:

KANATITZA Festival aims to showcase the cultural heritage of the Bulgarian community. It will be three-day family friendly event with the participation of numerous folklore groups from all over North America. It will include concert, traditional needlework exhibit, ethnic cuisine, movie screenings, and children's activities.



Project details:

The festival is named "Kanatitsa" after one of the universal symbols of the beginning of the family or the village, and of peace and unity. The symbol is very ancient (about 5300 years BC and is found in different parts of the Earth, regardless of religion and state structure.)

"Kanatitsa" on the other hand is phonetically close to Canada and it should make it memorable for the Canadian audience which is our target audience.

The logo for our festival is a symbol of the unification of the multicultural community of Burnaby. The visual image of the logo resembles mirrored triangles that touch at the top of the legs. The scissors, which is the main element of the ribbon, or in other words connected triangles in a different way symbolizes in Bulgarian folklore traditions the wise turtle. The turtle according to some Indigenous stories on the other hand holds the Earth on which we all live. Turtle Island - that's what some of Canada's indigenous people call North America. In some Indigenous legends the turtle is a symbol of life and the earth and is associated with various spiritual and cultural beliefs.

The festival is planned for September 21, 22 and 23, on which, Bulgaria celebrates one of the most significant events of its recent history - the declaration of Bulgarian independence.

It will have multiple events, leading to the three days celebration, as descried below:

• Festival badges and T-shirts for the participants

T-shirt and badges design competition will be announced in the spring of 2023. The winning design will be used to create T-shirts for all participants and volunteers. The best designs will be showcased in a special exhibition during the first day of the festival.

• Creation of a Bulgarian rosarium - a garden with Bulgarian roses.

Bulgarian roses are an obligatory element of the traditional Bulgarian yard. Maintaining a corner with roses in the yard of the Bulgarian woman, both from the cities and from the villages, is a centuries-old tradition of our people. We Bulgarians living permanently in Canada long to have a place where we will be surrounded by a sweet aroma and delicate colors, symbolizing Bulgaria.

With the help of the local city authorities in the city of Burnaby we plan to have a Bulgarian Roses mini garden, where the participants will visit and will celebrate the Bulgarian culture.

• Welcoming the arriving teams from North America on the territory of Vancouver

The first day of the festival (Thursday, September 21) will be dedicated to welcoming our guests from out of town. Festival logo badges and t-shirts for all performers will be distributed. We'll have some tours around Vancouver

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organized. Prior to their arrival, the dance troupes will be provided with information and assistance on hotels and tourist sites in the Vancouver, Burnaby and New Westminster areas. Teams will have the opportunity to sign up for organized tours of various tourist sites

Rose Garden Parade / Festival "Experience Bulgaria"

The second day (September 22 - Friday) of the festival will offer guests from all over North American a variety of entertainment in which they themselves will be able to participate. We are planning an outdoor stage in the park near the rose garden for performances, as well as numerous creative workshops. Thus, visitors will be able to see and enjoy a variety of activities - needlework workshops, a meeting with ethnographers, a costume review, and of course, a concert part with authentic folk music and dance. We also plan activities for the youngest visitors.

Meanwhile, two representatives from each ensemble will present the mayor of the municipality with a souvenir symbolizing the city/state they represent. The souvenir will be attached to a large map of North America, which will acquire a unique geographical presentation of "Bulgarian roses in North America".

• Concert of the participants

On the third day (September 23, 2023) Saturday will be the concert of the participants. This performance will take place in the M. J. Fox Theatre, which is the biggest theatre in Burnaby. All participants will presentation 10 to 15 minutes performances. After the concert dinner and dance party will be organized for the participants of the festival.

Media and publicity:

The festival will be advertised with printed posters in Community Centers across Vancouver Lower mainland, social media, email lists of cultural and dance organizations in Vancouver Lower mainland, as well as in Bulgarian media published in North America, such as the newspaper "Bulgarian Horizons", TV "Zornitsa" and Bulgarian Telegraph agency.

The festival organization and preparation will be done in close coordination with the Consulate General of the Republic of Bulgaria in Toronto, the honorary consul of the Republic of Bulgaria in Vancouver, Mr. Ron Suh, as well as the embassy of the Republic of Bulgaria in Ottawa. With their help, the invitation to the festival will undoubtedly reach all potential bands in Canada and the USA.

Please provide a brief history of your organization and describe its role in Burnaby.

August 21, 2001 is considered to be the birthday of the Bulgarian-Canadian Society in British Columbia. On that day 120 Bulgarians got together for a picnic in Aldergrove Lake Park and decided to form a Society. They elected a committee of 9 persons to deal with its official registration. BCSBC was registered as a non-profit organization with the BC Registry in January 22, 2002. The first annual general meeting of the Society was held on March 25, 2003. The official website of the Society was launched a year later - in 2004.

At the beginning of its existence, one of the igoals was to support all newly arrived Bulgarians and their families, who at that time were arriving in Canada in huge numbers. Following the establishment of the society multiple groups of interest were formed under its umbrella: Bulgarian Lions soccer team (2003), the Varna Chamber Choir (2004), folklore dance group Kitka (2003), Bulgarian Theatre Group "Why Not", and the electronic newspaper were created and vastly supported. Also the Bulgarian school's activity was under the leadership of the Bulgarian-Canadian Society of British

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Columbia.
