#### SUBJECT: WHEY-AH-WICHEN CANOE FESTIVAL

**PURPOSE:** To request Council approval of a Community Program Grant for the Tsleil-Waututh Nation for the Whey-ah-Wichen Canoe Festival, July 7 - 9, 2023

### RECOMMENDATION

**THAT** a Community Program Grant in the amount of \$10,000 be awarded to Tsleil-Waututh Nation in support of the Whey-ah-Wichen Canoe Festival, July 7 - 9, 2023.

### 1.0 POLICY SECTION

The provision of community grants is aligned with the following Council-adopted policies, plans, and strategies: *Burnaby Economic Development Strategy* (2007); *Social Sustainability Strategy* (2011), and the *Corporate Strategic Plan* (2017) that identifies the importance of a sense of belonging, inclusion, and high quality of life.

### 2.0 BACKGROUND

The Executive Committee of Council, at its Open meeting held on June 7, 2023, received the attached item of correspondence from the Tsleil-Waututh Nation requesting support from the City of Burnaby for the Whey-ah-Wichen Canoe Festival scheduled to take place from July 7 - 9 in North Vancouver. Due to the short timeline, the Executive Committee of Council accepted the letter in lieu of a formal grant application.

### 3.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

The Whey-ah-Wichen Canoe Festival will take place at Cates Park in North Vancouver from July 7 - 9, 2023. The Tsleil-Waututh Nation is requesting a grant in support of the event. The festival will welcome crews from several Indigenous communities across the southwest coast of BC and Washington.

### 4.0 COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The City of Burnaby's support will be acknowledged across the Tsleil-Waututh social media channels, in press releases, signage at the event, and in the program.

### 5.0 FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Grants are funded through the Community Grants Program. Current budget allocations and balance remaining as of this report date are detailed below.

Dear Mayor Hurley,

It is my pleasure to send greetings from the beautiful waters of the Tsleil-Waututh Nation, canoe pullers of the Burrard Inlet and other waters of the Salish Sea since time immemorial. We are excited to see signs of spring across our territory, in part because spring also brings excitement and planning for our annual Canoe Festival.

I would first like to acknowledge the City of Burnaby's past support for this event. As a friend of the Tsleil-Waututh and a supporter of the festival, you know that canoe culture is in our bones. It has been embedded in our way of life since time out of mind, with racing, in particular, enjoying a revival that began in 1910, when Chief George Sla-holt carved a canoe he named "Earwigs" that soon earned a reputation as an exceptional racing vessel.

Without the support of local donors like you, the festival would not have been become the exciting event that it is, nor would we have this opportunity to celebrate and share this vital part of Tsleil-Waututh culture with our friends and neighbors.

It is in the spirit of canoe culture that we are reaching out to the City of Burnaby today.
