5. CORRESPONDENCE

5.1 <u>Metro Vancouver - Re: Streamlining the Delivery of Rental Housing through</u> Pre-Approved Plans and Off-Site Construction

6.2 REVISED REZ #20-17 - A PORTION OF 6229 MARINE DRIVE - NON-MARKET HOUSING DEVELOPMENT - EDMONDS TOWN CENTRE PLAN

- b) The completion of a Subdivision Plan.
- c) The granting of any necessary Section 219 Covenants and Statutory Rights of Way.
