SUBJECT: 2023 SENIORS GROUPS LUNCH/DINNER GRANTS

PURPOSE: To seek Council authorization to award the 2023 lunch/dinner grants

to Burnaby based senior groups.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council award a grant of \$10 per person to Burnaby based seniors groups applying for a 2023 lunch or dinner grant.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.0 POLICY SECTION

The seniors lunch/dinner grant program is aligned with the following Council adopted City policies and plans/strategies: Corporate Strategic Plan (2022), Equity Policy (2020) and Social Sustainability Strategy (2011).

2.0 BACKGROUND

To receive a lunch/dinner grant, applicants submit a written request, providing the date and location of the event, and the number of residents who will be attending. This correspondence is included on the Executive Committee of Council (ECC) agenda to keep the ECC informed of the requests.

In previous years, the City received requests from Burnaby-based seniors groups for a grant in support of a holiday lunch/dinner for their residents or clients. The table below summarizes the value of the grants awarded annually between 2017 and 2022.
