SUBJECT: FESTIVAL BURNABY GRANTS

PURPOSE: To seek Council approval of Festival Burnaby Grant applications

received in June 2023.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the following Neighbourhood Event Festival Burnaby Grants be approved:

- **23-N-006** The Pandit Jasraj School of Music Foundation for their Indian Classical Vocal Recital: Ankita Joshi on September 24, 2023 \$3,000;
- 23-N-007 The Culture Chats BC Association for their Multicultural Music and Crafts Celebration on November 18, 2023 - \$1,500; and
- 23-N-008 The Student Association of the British Columbia Institute of Technology for their Burnaby Community Winterfest on November 15, 2023 - \$4,000.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Festival Burnaby Grant applications for Neighbourhood Events are being recommended to Council for approval. The eligible applications in this report total \$8,500. The remaining balance available in the 2023 Festivals Burnaby Grant budget is \$68,700.

1.0 POLICY SECTION

The grant application requests being received in this report are aligned with the following Council-adopted policies, plans and strategies:

• Burnaby Economic Development Strategy (2007); Social Sustainability Strategy (2011), and the Corporate Strategic Plan (2017) that identifies the importance of a sense of belonging, inclusion and high quality of life.

2.0 BACKGROUND

The Executive Committee of Council, at its Open meeting held on July 07, 2023, received a staff report outlining Festival Grant applications received and adopted the recommendations as noted above. This report seeks Council approval of the Festival Grants as recommended.

An application request for \$3,400 eligible amount has been received from the Pandit Jasraj School of Music Foundation for Ankita Joshi: Indian Classical Vocal Recital to be held on September 24, 2023, at Burnaby Hall. The event is expected to attract approximately 180 people.

The event is centered around the performance of a young and talented artist, Ankita Joshi. The international and renowned artist, Ankita Joshi, will be accompanied by local artists on harmonium and tabla. It is a celebration of cultural heritage with the goal to attract a wide audience especially the younger generation; to enhance and promote the role of Indian classical music, within the classical music community across all ethnicities. Grant funds will support artists/performers fees, venue/equipment rental, publicity/promotions and administration. Other revenues are pending from sponsorships, classes and low-cost ticket sales for performances.

The Pandit Jasraj School of Music Foundation is a Gurukul (institute) of the ancient art of Hindustani Classical Vocal Music established in 1994 and is the first institute of the Mewati Gharana in North America. A gharana is a system of social organization linking musicians or dancers by lineage or apprenticeship, and by adherence to a particular musical style. The school provides ongoing instruction to students, presents workshops, seminars and recitals, encourages youth to participate and learn music, trains teachers and seeks greater exposure for classical music.

An application request for \$2,000 eligible amount has been received from the Culture Chats BC Association for their Multicultural Music and Crafts Celebration to be held on November 18, 2023, at Burnaby Neighbourhood House. The event is expected to attract approximately 75 people.

The one-day event will be held to celebrate Multiculturalism Week in BC and feature local immigrant and refugee artists/artisans displaying their work, multicultural stories, music, arts, crafts and activities aimed at children, families and caregivers. The annual free-ofcharge festival aims to build awareness, interest and participation of people from all cultures in arts while creating community. Grant funds will support artists/performers fees, publicity/promotions, and administration. Other revenues are confirmed by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada and Culture Chats.

The Culture Chats BC Association is a non-profit organization incorporated in 2017 that promotes cultural diversity through engagement with literary and other arts among local communities. Programs and events organized include creative writing, art and craft workshops, multicultural story time events and other community engagement projects. The Association currently runs two book clubs and a number of literary workshops and events with members from both Canadian born and immigrant backgrounds to build stronger connections through a common interest in reading and writing.

An application request for \$4,000 eligible amount has been received from the Student Association of the British Columbia Institute of Technology for their Burnaby Community WinterFest to be held on November 15, 2023, at the Great Hall at BCIT Campus. The event is expected to attract approximately 2,500 people.

The second annual winter festival brings the local community and BCIT students together to celebrate and enjoy seasonal festivities. It is a free-of-charge event featuring seasonal snacks and beverages, music performances, magicians, raffles, arts and crafts, artisans and much more. The festival hopes to attract young Burnaby families and working individuals between the ages of 28-42, plus students that attend our Burnaby campus (18-30). Grant funds will support artists/performers fees, payments to community

contributors, publicity, and administration. Other revenues are pending from corporate sponsorships, vendor booth rentals and BCIT.

The BCIT Student Association is an established non-profit organization that exists since 1966 to enhance student life and the organization produces dozens of special events and festivals throughout the year with full time staff and volunteers to plan and implement. Its mission is to be an advocate for students and provide student-centered, responsive and proactive services that support and enhance the quality of life of students.

4.0 COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

All individuals and organizations receiving funding from the Burnaby Festivals Grant Program must acknowledge the support in all promotional materials with the Festivals Burnaby Grant Program logo.

5.0 FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The City's annual Festivals Grant budget for 2023 is \$250,000 and is funded through the gaming reserve. The following table provides a financial summary of the grant program to date. There is sufficient funding available should all eligible requests included in this report be approved by Committee and Council.

Applications for Neighbourhood scale festivals will continue to be submitted throughout the year (except July and August).

The last intake for small- and large-scale festivals is October 15, 2023, for festivals and special events taking place in January through June 2024. These applications are not processed and considered by Committee and Council until early 2024, therefore the funding for the small- and large-scale events from the October intake are part of the 2024 budget.
