

P R O C L A M A T I O N

Commencing on May 23rd next for 12 calendar months following.

SECOND SECTION:

In the matter of the Election of Miss Burnaby and maids.

It has been decided by the delegates forming the executive of the May Day Committee to call upon the High Schools of Burnaby for this year to choose a girl from among their number to Crown the Queen of the May (in place of the ex Queen who will function another year)

The method of balloting as outlined for May Queen may be observed in the case of Miss Burnaby and her maids. Similarly only that two names shall be sent in from each school--one of which will be Queen the other maids of honor--To be drawn from the hat by the Reeve.

THIRD SECTION

Whereas upon historic occasions it has always been deemed necessary to surround the Person of the Sovereign with suitable escort, it has been decided to include these several boyish offices to be filled in a like manner as indicated for the nomination and election of the May Queen--marking envelopes with boy ballots "Boy" to avoid confusion. The offices to be, - Earl Marshall, Two Heralds, Two Pages. One boy's name from each school.

SECTION IV. RULES

Girl Candidates for Queen to be of the age of 13 sometime during the current year.
