# SECOND BURNABY TROOP ENJOY HIKE

## Signalling and Cooking Tests Passed by Many Scouts.

The start was made from the New Westminster bridge at 1 p.m., and the boys hiked by way of the Scott and River roads, arriving at their destination about 4 p.m., although the weather was very wet everyone showed the proper scout spirit and every face was wreathed in smiles. The troop was fortunate in being able to obtain the use of an empty house to sleep in and everyone went to bed feeling happy.

Some of the nearby farmers sent over a large quantity of eggs so that Easter was properly observed as far as the eggs were concerned. Sunday evening was spent around the campfire singing songs and telling stories, but about 9:30 p.m. everybody was ready for bed as there had not been much sleep the previous night. Monday was another fine day and many tests were passed, it being an excellent chance for the signallers to get in some long distance work. Camp was broken about 2 p.m. on Monday and the hike back to town undertaken.

The boys were fortunate in having A. S. M. Jack Allen of the 1st New Westminster Troop and Scoutmaster Wm. Mundy, late of the 2nd Deptford Troop, London, Eng., accompany them. Mr. Mundy gave the boys a talk on "Playing the Game," which was appreciated by all.

Selection Also Made of  
Princess, Maids of Honor  
And Date May 23.

EDMONDS, April 28.—Burnaby's first May Queen will be Ruth Bearn, a pupil at Riverway West School, and a member of 1st Burnaby Girl Guides. She is a daughter of "Billy" Bearn, formerly municipal chauffeur, and was born in Burnaby.

Miss Agnes Kilgour of North Burnaby High School, who will take the part of Princess Burnaby, is also a native of the municipality.

Frank Harcourt of Riverway East School, who will act as Earl Marshal, is a member of 2nd Burnaby Troop of Boy Scouts.

## Burnaby Scouts Busy Preparing for May Day

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd Burnaby troops are busily engaged in preparing for the first Burnaby May Day, which is to be held at Central Park on May 23. The scouts of the municipality have been requested to form a guard of honor for the May Queen and are anxious to make a good showing. The balloting for May Queen was held in the seventeen different schools of the municipality and it is very gratifying to know that the girl chosen, Ruth Bearn, is a member of the 1st Burnaby Company Girl Guides, and the earl marshal, who is to accompany her, Frank Harcourt, is a member of the 2nd Burnaby troop Boy Scouts.

Scoutmaster Wm. Mundy, late of the 2nd Deptford troop, who has come to reside in the municipality, has taken over the formation of a troop at St. Barnabas' Church.

The May Day committee is working hard to ensure that Burnaby's first festival of the kind shall be not merely successful but shall be one of the "mile-stones" in the history of the municipality.

It has been decided to hold a general "field day" for all Burnaby residents at Central Park on Empire Day, which this year will be celebrated on Saturday, May 23.

It is planned that the occasion shall also include a reunion of Burnaby pioneers, who are being invited through the press to communicate with any member of the committee signifying their willingness to take part in the May Day parade.

It is proposed to have present the first pioneers to settle in Burnaby, including the first school boy, the first school teacher, the first storekeeper, the first manufacturer, and other pioneers.

The committee will meet at the I. O. O. F. Hall on Thursday, April 30, when many matters of importance will be considered and all members are requested to attend.
