





## 'Wonderful guy' feted

OTTAWA—A group of MPs of all political persuasions said farewell Monday to Harold Winch, a New Democratic Party member who is ending almost 40 years in provincial and federal politics.

Winch, 65, who won his first election in 1933, has announced he will not run again for the Vancouver East seat he has held in the Commons since 1963.

A small reception was held for him by Commons Speaker Lucien Lamoureux to mark the years of service Winch has con-

tributed to the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association.

As Winch has indicated that he is not interested in a farewell reception by his party, the gathering probably is the only parliamentary goodbye the veteran politician will receive.

The Speaker presented Winch with a barometer on behalf of members of the parliamentary association and described him as a parliamentarian, a member of the association and a wonderful gentleman who was not afraid to express his views.

## Sikhs honor Winch

The highest honor for Sikhs, a ceremonial sword called the kirpan, was presented to Vancouver East MP Harold Winch here Sunday for battling during his 39 years in politics for East Indians in Canada.

Winch is the first non-Sikh in Canada to receive the kirpan. The kirpan was presented last to the first prime minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, in 1954.

Twenty-five years ago in the B.C. legislature the New Democrat won for East Indians and Chinese the right to vote in provincial elections — a policy subsequently accepted by the federal government. In 1967 he succeeded in getting the immigration quota system changed for the East Indians.

Winch received the kirpan at a ceremony brilliantly colorful in dress and surroundings at the Khalsa Diwan Society's Sikh Temple, with more than 1,000 in the congregation.

Secretary Sohan S. Sangha handed the sword to head priest Giani Balbir Singh, who then handed it to Winch "according to the principles of the Sikh religion." The kirpan is the top of five religious symbols. The "bhog ceremony" was preceded by a week of recitation of the holy Guru Granth Sahib, the Sikh bible of 1,432 pages that is read from the first to last word, by priest Giani Balbir Singh.

The whole recitation formed a prayer for Winch's good health. A reception lunch was provided by Sabu Singh.

Winch said he knew enough about the kirpan not to withdraw it completely. "For if I do, I have to use it, and have

to spill blood for the defence of the faith."

During his address, he said it was 25 years ago this year that the East Indians won the right to vote in Canada.

"With India and Canada both members of the British

Commonwealth, it was a disgrace for Canadians to deny their brothers and sisters in India the right to be equal here, to deny the right to vote, to deny the right of access to all the major professions in Canada."


Winch entered politics in

1933, became leader of the Opposition for the CCF in the legislature from 1941 to 1953, then went into federal politics as a New Democrat.



Last November he announced he will not be a candidate at the next federal election.
