A By-law to authorize the expropriation of certain lands for the purpose of making roads in the Municipality of Burnaby.

WHEREAS under Subsection 176 of Section 53 of the "Municipal Act" the Council is authorized to pass by-laws for establishing, opening, making, preserving, improving, repairing, widening, altering, diverting and stopping up roads, streets, squares, alleys, lanes or other public communications within the boundaries of the Municipality or the jurisdiction of the Council and for entering upon, expropriating, breaking up, taking or using any real property in any way necessary or convenient for the said purposes without the consent of the owners of the real property subject to the restrictions contained in Sections 394 to 413 inclusive of the said Act.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and necessary in the interest of the Municipality of Burnaby to establish open and make certain roads and highways within the Municipality and to widen and extend certain roads and highways already established in the said Municipality.

THE Municipal Council of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby enacts as follows :-

1. The lands mentioned and described in the Schedule attached hereto are hereby established and opened as roads and highways.

2. The Municipality of Burnaby for the purpose aforesaid hereby expropriates the said lands.

3. The Municipality may enter upon and take possession of and use the said lands or any of them subject to the restrictions contained in Sections 394 to 413 inclusive of the "Municipal Act."

4. This By-law may be cited as the "BURNABY HIGHWAY EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW 1912."

SCHEDULE OF LANDS INCLUDED IN BURNABY HIGHWAY


EXPROPRIATION BY-LAW 1912 ALL BEING SITUATED IN GROUP 1
IN THE DISTRICT OF NEW WESTMINSTER AND PROVINCE OF BRITISH
COLUMBIA.

1. A portion of Lots One (1) and Two (2) of Lot Six (6) of the middle portion of Lot Ninety-one (91) Group One (1) New Westminster District more particularly described as follows:- Commencing at a post planted on the Southerly boundary of the middle portion of Lot 91 Group 1, the same being the point of intersection of the Easterly boundary of Lot 6 and the Westerly boundary of Lot 5, of the Southerly portion of Lot 91 aforesaid; thence North $63^{\circ}16'$ West (mag) and following the said Westerly boundary of Lots 5 and Easterly boundary of Lot 6, produced Northerly One Hundred and Sixty-five (165) feet to a post set on the Northerly boundary of Lot 2 of Lot 6 of the middle portion of Lot 91; thence South $26^{\circ}49'$ West (mag) and following the Northerly boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, Thirty-three (33) feet to a post; thence South $63^{\circ}16'$ East (mag) One Hundred and Sixty-five (165) feet to a post set on the Southerly boundary of Lot 1 aforesaid; thence Northwestwardly and following said Southerly Boundary Thirty-three (33) feet to the point of commencement.

2. A portion of Lot Two (2) Block Six (6) of the central portion of Lot Ninety-one (91) Group One (1) New Westminster District more particularly described as follows :- Commencing at a post set on the North boundary of Subdivision Lot 2 of Block 6 of the central portion of Lot 91 Group 1 the same being set Twenty-one decimal seventy-five (21.75) feet South $26^{\circ}49'$ East (mag) of the Northeast corner thereof; thence South $63^{\circ}15'$ East (mag) One Hundred and Sixty-five (165) feet to a post set on the South boundary of said Subdivision Lot 2; thence Westwardly and following the South boundary of said Subdivision Lot 2, Thirty-three (33) feet to a post; thence North $63^{\circ}15'$ West

(mag) One Hundred and Sixty-five (165) feet to a post set on the North boundary of Subdivision Lot 2 aforesaid; thence Eastwardly and following the Northerly boundary of Subdivision Lot 2 Thirty-three (33) feet to the point of commencement, and containing 0.125 of an acre be the same more or less.
