

CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 276

A By-law to regulate the sale of beverages made from malt or hops or containing not more than two and one-half per cent proof spirits.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The word "liquor" wherever used in this by-law shall mean a beverage made of malt or hops or containing not more than two and one-half per cent proof spirits.
2. No person shall sell liquor within the Municipality of Burnaby without having obtained a license therefor.
3. The Chief of Police of the Corporation of Burnaby, or such other person as the Council may by resolution appoint, shall be License Inspector under this by-law and he shall report to the Council.
4. Every application for license to sell liquor shall be accompanied by a fee of \$2.50 to cover inspection.
5. Every application for a license shall be in writing signed by the applicant and shall give in detail the location and the description of the premises wherein it is proposed to carry on the business of a retailer of liquor, and such application shall be directed to the Municipal Clerk.
6. No license shall be granted until after the expiration of two weeks from the date upon which the application therefor was first considered by the Council.
7. The Council shall have power by resolution to grant or refuse the license applied for and to suspend or cancel any license

issued, without giving any reason therefor to the applicant or licensee.

8. If any licensee shall be convicted of any offence against the provisions of the "Prohibition Act" or under this by-law the license shall ipso facto become cancelled.

9. The premises wherein liquor as above defined is sold shall be open to view from the street without having to enter the premises wherein the liquor is sold.

10. The licensee shall not sell nor in his premises permit the sale of liquor to a minor, except upon a written order from the parent or guardian of such minor. Any such order shall be surrendered to the licensee upon each sale and be retained by him.

11. The licensee shall not suffer or permit any intoxicated person or any prostitute or person or persons of known loose and immoral character to resort to his premises; nor shall he permit or allow any disorderly conduct in or upon such premises.

12. The licensee shall not employ a woman or women for the purpose of selling liquor.

13. The licensee shall not sell nor permit the sale of liquor between the hours of 11 p.m. of any day, and 7 a.m. of the following day; nor on the Lord's Day.

14. A license issued under this by-law shall not be transferable.

15. The word "bar" shall not be written, painted or printed on any premises wherein liquor is sold nor shall the licensee use the word "bar" in advertising his premises.

16. No change or alteration to the licensed premises shall be made without the approval of the Council, and the fee for the inspection of any such change or alterations shall be \$2.50.

17. The license shall be at all times exhibited in a prominent position within the said licensed premises.

18. No license under this by-law shall be granted to any person who is not a British subject.

19. The licensee shall pay a license fee of \$5.00 to 31st December, 1920, and thereafter the license shall run from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December in each year, and the license fee shall be \$10.00 and shall be payable in two instalments of \$5.00 for each six months or any part thereof and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

20. Every person to whom a license has been granted under this by-law shall at all times permit the License Inspector or any Police Officer of the Municipality or other person duly authorized in that behalf to inspect his premises, and any person who shall refuse to allow the License Inspector or any Police Officer or any other person duly authorized in that behalf to so inspect such premises shall be guilty of an infraction of this by-law.

21. Any person who shall violate any provision of this by-law shall be liable upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 and in default of payment to imprisonment not exceeding three months.

22. This by-law shall come into force and take effect from the 1st day of July, 1920.

23. This by-law may be cited as "ZBURNABY LIQUOR LICENSE BY-LAW 1920".
