

CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY.

BY-LAW NO. 316.

A BY-LAW to regulate constructions of buildings
within the Municipality of Burnaby.

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE
DISTRICT OF BURNABY enacts as follows:-

1. It shall be unlawful for anyone to construct any new building or make any addition to any existing building exceeding Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars in value until a permit has first been applied for and obtained.

2. Applications for permit must be made on form prescribed and approved by the Municipal Engineer and must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration of the value of the proposed building or improvements.

3. The Municipal Engineer may require plans of the proposed building or improvements to be filed and may grant or refuse a permit.

4. A fee of Twenty-five (25¢) Cents shall accompany each application for a permit.

5. Any person guilty of an infraction of any of the conditions of this By-law shall upon summary conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars and costs and in default of payment to imprisonment for not more than two months.

6. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY BUILDING BY-LAW, 1921".
