

CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 366.

A BY-LAW to amend the "Burnaby Extra-ordinary Traffic Regulation By-law, No. 2, 1922.

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby enacts as follows:-

1. Clause One (1) of the "Burnaby Extra-ordinary Traffic Regulation By-law, No. 2, 1922" is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:-

"1. Extra-ordinary traffic shall include any  
"carriage of goods or persons over a highway,  
"at either one or more times, and whether in  
"vehicles drawn by animal power or propelled by  
"some other means, which taken in conjunction  
"with the nature or existing condition of the  
"highway is so extraordinary or improper in the  
"quality or quantity of the goods or the number  
"of persons carried, or in the mode or time of  
"use of the highway, or in the speed at which  
"the vehicles are driven or operated, as, in the  
"opinion of the Council, or of such person as may  
"be appointed for that purpose by resolution of  
"the Council, substantially to alter or increase  
"the burden imposed on the highway through its  
"proper use by ordinary traffic, and to cause damage  
"and expense in respect of the highway beyond what  
"is reasonable or ordinary.

2. This By-law shall come into effect when approved by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council.

3. This By-law may be cited as the "BURNABY EXTRA-ORDINARY TRAFFIC REGULATION BY-LAW, NO. 2, 1922, AMENDMENT BY-LAW, 1922".

DONE AND PASSED in open Council this Nineteenth (19th) day of June, 1922.
