

## Burnaby Re-Sale By-Law 1902.

Whereas by subsection [c] of Section 6 of the Municipal Clauses Amendment Act 1898, power is granted to a Municipal Council to make provision for the sale of property bought in by the Corporation at a Tax sale:

And whereas the following lands were duly bought in on behalf of the Corporation of the Township or District of Burnaby, at the adjourned Tax sale held on the twenty fourth day of October AD 1899 viz:-

District Lot 120, containing 160 acres more or less, in Group One, New Westminster District.

And whereas on the sixteenth day of October AD 1900 an Order was made by the late Honourable Chief Justice Mac Coll, a Judge of the Supreme Court of British Columbia, confirming the said sale:

And whereas the said lands have not been redeemed within one year from the date of the said recited Order exclusive of that day.

Be it therefore enacted by the Reeve and Council of the District of Burnaby in open Council assembled that the Council may by a resolution sanctioned by a two-thirds vote, sell said property or any portion of it at such price as the resolution may specify, and the Reeve and Clerk of the Corporation are authorized to execute conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers in accordance with the terms

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terms of the Resolution.

This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Burnaby Re-sale Bylaw 1902"




