CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 528

A BY-LAW to amend the "BURNABY HEALTH BY-LAW 1926" being By-law No. 509 of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the District of Burnaby RNACTS as follows:-

1. Interpretation

Section One (1) of the Burnaby Health By-law 1926, being By-law No. 509 of the Corporation is hereby amended by striking out the interpretation of the word "animal" and substituting therefor the following:

The word "animal" shall mean any sheep or goat, except a mountain sheep or mountain goat, and any cow, horse, mule, ass or swine.

- 2. Section Twenty five (25) of the said By-law is hereby amended by striking out the words "fur bearing animal" in the second line thereof and by striking out the words "save and except rabbits and muskrats" in the fourth and fifth lines thereof.
- keep any fur bearing animal for commercial purposes on any parcel of land in the Municipality having an area of less than six thousand (6000) square feet and on any parcel of land having a greater area than six thousand (6000) square feet the area of ground space for each fur-bearing kept thereon shall be determined by the Health Inspector, having regard to the species of fur-bearing animal kept or proposed to be kept thereon, the nature of the soil, and the locality of the parcel of land in its relation to residences.
- 4. Section 29a. No stable or pen for housing any animal or fur-bearing animal, kept for commercial purposes, or

game animal shall be located at a lesser distance than eighty (80) feet from any residence, other than that of the owner.

5. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY HEALTH BY-LAW 1926 AMENDMENT BY-LAW 1926"
