

By-law No. 95

A By-law for regulating the Procedure at Meetings of the
Municipal Council.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the
District of Burnaby enacts as follows :-

1. The Council may from time to time by resolution adopt, amend and repeal Rules, Orders and Regulations not inconsistent with or repugnant to the Municipal Clauses Act and Amending Acts for the proper government of all regular and special meetings of the Council, the number of its members that shall constitute a quorum, the appointment of standing and select committees, the powers, duties and proceedings of such committees and such other matters and things as may be expedient or necessary for the due fulfillment of the duties of the said Council and its officers.
2. No amendment of the Rules and Orders relating to the meetings of the Council and the proceedings at such meetings shall be made unless : (a) at least one week's notice of such amendment shall be given in writing at a regular or special meeting of the Council; (b) by unanimous consent of the Reeve and all the councillors then in office being present.
3. All by-laws hereafter passed shall be numbered consecutively from 1. onwards but such number shall not be construed and need not be quoted as part of the title or short title of the by-law to which it is attached.
4. The Municipal Clerk shall keep a book to be known as the 'By-law Register' in which he shall enter under its proper consecutive number the short title and date of passing of every by-law hereafter passed by the Council. Opposite to each such entry in separate columns he shall make note of the date when such by-law was registered and also the date when published in the British Columbia Gazette or newspapers (if such be the case) and also shall note whether the by-law is of general application or for some


special or temporary purpose.

5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to place on the Reeve's desk at each meeting of the Council a correct statement of the business of the meeting arranged in its proper order and also to faithfully carry out such instructions as may from time to time be given whether by resolution of the Council or by the Reeve.

6. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY PROCEDURE BY-LAW 1911."
