

A BY-LAW to authorize the Comporation of the Distxiot of Burnaby to acquire an Easement for Corporate purposes.

WHEREAS it is desirable and expedient that an Easement ahould be acquired on and over the hereinafter described property for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a arainage ditoh in the Municipality of Burnaby.

AND WHEREAS Frank X. Cormier and Alfred Joseph Cormier, in the Municipality of Burnaby, Provinoe of British Columbia, are the owners in fee of the hereinafter described property:

AND WHERRAS under the provisions of paragraph (a) of sub-section 30 of Section 54 of the "Munioipal Act" the Municipal Council is authorized to make and pass a by-law to acquire or accept easements.

THAREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Distriot of Burnaby HNACTS as follows:-
(1) It shall be lawful for the Muniolpal Council of the corporation of the District of Burnaby to acquire an . easement from Frank X. Cormier and Alfred Joseph Cormier, In the Muniaipality of Burnaby, and Province of British Columbia, on and over a portion of a 2.00 acre portion of Lots two (2) and three (3), Blook twenty-rive (85), Distriot Lot twenty-seven (27), Group One (1), District of New Westminster, Province of British Columbia, according to Plan No. 697 and Sketch No. 6393 and being more particularly desaribed as follows:-

COMABNCING at a point on the Southeasterly Boundary of the 2.00 acre portion of Lots 2 and 3 , aforesaid, said point being located 115.2 feet, N. $50^{\circ}$ 21' $\mathbf{F}_{4}$, from the most Southerly Corner of said 2.00 acre portion;
thence N. $50^{\circ} 25^{\circ}$ W., 185.9 feet;
thence N. $55^{\circ} 00^{\circ}$ W., 41.6 feet;
thence N. $69^{\circ} 26^{\circ}$ W., 98.9 feet to an intersection With the Northwesterly Boundary of the 2.00 acre portion of Lots 2 and 3 , aforesaid;

The above described line being the centre line of a strip or land, 10 feet in width and bounded by the Southeasterly and Northwesterly Boundaries of said 2.00 a ore portion and containing, by admeasureinent, 0.075 of an acre, be the same more or less, as shown on the plan hereunto annexed and thereon outlined with red colour.
paying therefore the sum of One Dollar ( $\$ 1,00$ ) of lawful money of Canada.
(2) This By-law may be cited as the "CORMIER EASTMENT
