
CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 1531.

Municipal Act, Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1924, Chap. 179 and Amending Acts.



whereas by Section 66 of the said Municipal Act it is provided that the Municipal Council of every Municipality shall from time to time pass by-laws for fixing the number of infants to be received into a house thereafter in the said Act called a "nursing home".

AND WHEREAS Hugh M. Fraser, has, by Order in Council dated the 9th. day of February, 1934, been appointed Commissioner for the Municipality of Burnaby under Part 23 of the said Municipal Act and has, under the said statute, power, subject to the approval of the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council, to make such by-laws as might be made by the Council of the said Municipality.

THEREFORE THE SAID COMMISSIONER in exercise of all the powers him thereunto enabling enacts as follows:-

- 1. Pursuant to the said Section 66 of the Municipal Act the maximum number of infants to be received into or retained in any house situated in the Municipality of Burnaby in the Province of British Columbia, being anursing home within the meaning of the said Section 66, is hereby fixed at three infants and it shall be unlawful for any person to receive into or retain in such house for hire or reward more than three infants for the purpose of nursing or maintaining such infant or infants apart from his, her or their parent for a longer period than twenty-four hours.
- 2. The provisions of this by-law shall not extend to the relatives or guardians of any infant received or retained as aforesaid nor to Benevolent or Charitable Institutions established for the protection or care of infants or authorized by the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council to exercise the powers conferred by part I. of the "Infants Act".

3. Any person who violates any provision of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding \$100.00 and costs.

THIS BY-LAW shall not come into force unless and until it shall have received the approval of the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council.

THIS BY-LAW may be cited for all purposes as the "BURNABY NURSING HOME BY-LAW 1935".
