

CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 1601

A BY-LAW to dedicate certain street allowances
within the Municipality of Burnaby.

WHEREAS under the provisions of sub-section (217) of Section 59 of the Municipal Act being Chapter 199 Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1936, the Municipal Council is authorized to make by-laws for establishing, opening, making preserving, improving, repairing, widening, altering, diverting or stopping up roads, streets, squares, alleys, lanes, bridges or other public thoroughfares.

AND WHEREAS it is desirable and expedient that certain lands should be dedicated for the purpose of street allowances in the Municipality of Burnaby.

THEREFORE the Commissioner for the Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as Follows:

1. That the following parcels of land, all in Group One (1) New Westminster District, shall be and are hereby dedicated for street purposes, that is to say:-

(a) The Northerly Thirty three (33) feet of Block Six (6) District Lot Eleven (11) Map No. 3045, Extending from the Easterly boundary to the Westerly boundary of said Block Six (6) and adjoining Block Nine (9).

(b) The Southerly Thirty three (33) feet of Lot Twenty-eight (28) of Block Fifteen (15) of subdivision of District Lots One hundred and fifty one (151), One hundred and fifty two (152) and One hundred and Fifty three (153), Map No. 1109, Extending from the Easterly boundary to the Westerly boundary of said Lot Twenty eight (28) and adjoining the right of way of the B. C. Electric Railway Co. as shown on Map No. 3962.

2. This By-law may be cited as "Burnaby Street Dedication By-law No. 2. 1937"
