BYLAW NO. 10354

A BYLAW to authorize an Agreement with the Board of School Trustees to contribute to the cost of facilities

WHEREAS Council is authorized by section 682 of the Municipal Act to enter into an agreement with the Board of School Trustees to contribute to the cost of construction, maintenance, operation or use of facilities for community uses, on a site the title of which is vested in or is held by a party to the Agreement;

AND WHEREAS The Board of School Trustees of School District No. 41 (Burnaby) is the registered owner or lessee of the lands situated in the City of Burnaby and known as Douglas Road Elementary School and South Slope Elementary School (hereinafter called "the said schools");

AND WHEREAS Council is desirous of contributing the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) to the cost of playground projects at the said schools;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as BURNABY COMMUNITY FACILITIES CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT BYLAW NO. 1, 1996.
2. The Council is hereby authorized and empowered to enter into the Agreement contained in Schedule "A" with The Board of School Trustees of School District No. 41


(Burnaby) to contribute Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) to the cost of playground projects for the said schools.

WHEREAS the City is authorized by Bylaw No. 10354 to enter into an agreement with the School Board for the purpose of contribution to the cost of developing playgrounds at certain school sites in Burnaby more particularly described below;

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSES that in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained and subject to the terms and conditions hereafter set out the parties hereto agree as follows:


1. The School Board covenants that it is the registered owner or lessee of those lands and premises in the City of Burnaby known as Douglas Road Elementary School and South Slope Elementary School, such lands being more particularly described as:

- (a) Parcel Identifier: 009-259-759  
Lot 48, District Lot 80, Group 1,  
New Westminster District, Plan 22585;
- (b) Parcel Identifier: 017-475-678  
Parcel "A", District Lot 99, Group 1,  
New Westminster District, Plan LMP1432;

respectively (collectively referred to hereinafter as "the said schools"); and FURTHER the School Board covenants that the playground projects will be developed at the said schools in 1996.

2. The City agrees to pay to the School Board Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000) as a contribution to the cost of playground projects for the two said schools.





- WHEREAS, Community Schools optimize the use of school facilities, and
- WHEREAS, Community Schools enrich the K-12 program by making the resources of the community more available to the school and vice-versa, and
- WHEREAS, Community Schools provide a delivery system for the activities organized by Recreation, Adult Education, and other agencies, and
- WHEREAS, there is a rising public insistence that all levels of government become more responsive to citizen needs and desires; and
- WHEREAS, there is a limited amount of tax monies and other human and physical resources available to meet public demands for facilities, programs and services, it is recognized that it is economically incumbent on all agencies to work closely together to maximize the effect of current and future programs and facilities, and
- WHEREAS, there is an increasing need for all governmental units and related public service organizations to mobilize their respective resources for the common purpose of improving the quality of community life; and
- WHEREAS, Provincial legislation recognizes and authorizes local governments, including school districts, to make formal agreements for joint planning and performance of functions; and
- WHEREAS, School District No. 41 has facilities, equipment and staff organized for the purpose of providing education opportunities for the citizens within the district; and
- WHEREAS, the Municipality of Burnaby provides facilities, staff, and certain recreational and service programs for the citizens within the district; and
- WHEREAS, a multitude of other related public and private community organizations provide programs and services for community betterment; and
- WHEREAS, no single, cohesive strategy for the development and utilization of all these relevant community resources has yet been established; and
- WHEREAS, there are great potential social and economic benefits to be derived from further co-operation in facility and program development for the benefit of all citizens through Community School programs at the local neighborhood level.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the undersigned endorse, support, and agree fully to participate in the joint planning, development, and operation of Community School programs within their respective service areas.
