BYLAW NO. 10752

A BYLAW respecting temporary signs on boulevards during elections

The Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

- 1. This Bylaw may be cited as BURNABY SIGN BYLAW 1972, AMENDMENT BYLAW 1998.
- 2. Section (9) of Schedule No. 1 of Burnaby Sign Bylaw 1972 is repealed and the following substituted therefor:
 - "(9) Temporary signs pertaining to campaigns, drives or events of political, civic, philanthropic, educational or religious organizations, but no such signs shall be erected on park land under the jurisdiction of the Parks and Recreation Commission. Signs may be erected on boulevards with the consent of Council if the applicant has agreed in writing to remove the signs within three days after the campaign, drive or event has concluded, but no signs shall be placed on or in front of flower or shrub beds nor along the 60 metre portion of Nelson Avenue and of Imperial Street fronting on the Cenotaph located at the northwest corner of their intersection."
