BYLAW NO. 11404

A BYLAW authorizing the expenditure of monies in the
Capital Works, Machinery and Equipment
Reserve Fund

WHEREAS there is an unappropriated balance in the Capital Works, Machinery and
Equipment Reserve Fund (hereinafter called "the said Reserve Fund") established pursuant to Bylaw
No. 7256 of \$56,684,104.01 as at the 26th day of June, 2002, calculated as follows:

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to expend \$130,000 of the said balance to
undertake additional work to complete the Barnet Marine Park Master Plan (hereinafter called "the
said works");

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the City of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This Bylaw may be cited as **BURNABY CAPITAL WORKS, MACHINERY AND
EQUIPMENT RESERVE FUND EXPENDITURE BYLAW NO. 18, 2002.**

2. The sum of \$130,000 is hereby appropriated from the said Reserve Fund to be expended for the said works.


3. Should any of the said sum of \$130,000 remain unexpended after the expenditures hereby authorized have been made, any unexpended balance shall be returned to the credit of the said Reserve Fund.
