BY-LAW NO. 3066

A BY-LAW to amend the "BURNABY SANITARY BY-LAW 1920"

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:-

- 1. Section One (1) of the "Burnaby Sanitary By-law 1920" as amended by By-laws No. 375, and 672 of The Corporation is hereby struck out and the following substituted the refor:
  - "1. Subject to the provisions of Section 9 hereof every owner and occupant of any building in which one or more persons reside, or work, or carry on any occupation, trade of calling within the Municipality of Burnaby which is fitted or equipped with a toilet, urinal, levatory or bath, or any of them, shall, unless connected with the common sewer, treat and dispose of all sewerage or waste from such building in and by a soptic tank and rook pit or sub-irginal disposal system constructed to the setisfaction of the Medical Health Officer or other authorized ingrector of the Municipality, in accordance of the plans and opacifications as now adopted by the Council of The Corporation of the District of Burneby, and attached to and made part of this by-law and marked Plan "A", Plan "h", and Plan "C". The Medical Wealth Officer of The Vorporation or other authorized inspector of the Municipality shall determine which of the said plans shall be followed, having in mind the eres of the land upon which the building to be served is located, the nature of the soil and the topography of the said property, and the decision of the said Medical Mealth Officer or other authorized inspector of the Municipality shall be final and binding."

By-law No. 283 is lereby further exended by adding after paragraph 11, as paragraph 11e, the following:-

"lla. Septic tanks shell be ole and thoroughly when solids appear in the effluent, or whenever the combined volume of aludge and soun occupies one quarter to one third the total tank volume below the 'flow line'."

- This By-lew shall take effect upon registration 3. the re of in the sannar required by law.
- This By-law may be cited as "BUNNABY BANITARY BY-LAW 1920 AMENDERNY BY-LAN 1950."



## — SPECIFICATION —

LUMBER

The Tank shall be built of No. 1 Common Cedar and shall be made watertight.

**OUTLET &** INLET

To be of 4" Vitrified Tees. Joints to be carefully cemented and wiped off smooth on inside of pipe.

DISTANCE BELOW GROUND

Where conditions permit, top of Tank should be 1'-0" below ground level but this depth must be governed by drainage conditions of the locality. The tank should not be sunk any deeper, as the top must be removed every two years for the removal of sludge and scum.

LOCATION

Septic Tank should, where possible, be on the lower side of the house and shall be 10 feet from any part thereof, including Verandah and steps.

There must be a separate Septic Tank and Rock Pit for each house and must be located on the same lot as the house which it serves.

**ROCK-PIT** 

Rock-pit to be of hand-packed boulders and of cubic capacity approximately double that of the Tank. To be connected to the Tank by 4" Agricultural Tile pipe. Where possible, Rock-pit to be 30 feet distant from Septic Tank.

INSPECTION The Septic Tank, Rock-pit and all drains to be inspected before being used. The Tank, Pit and Drains must not be covered until certified as efficient by the Septic Tank Inspector.





## - - - SPECIFICATION - - -

CONCRETE Three parts stone or rock broken to pass through 2" ring, three parts clean gravel, 4 parts clean Pit sand, two parts Portland cement. The Septic Tank as shown will require approximately 1-3/4 Cu. Yards of aggregate and 8 sacks of cement.

DISTANCE Where conditions permit top of tank should be BELOW one foot below ground level, but if this is impracticable a reinforced concrete top with manhole giving access to both chambers must be constructed.

LOCATION The septic tank should, where possible be on the lower side of the house and at least five feet from any part of the house, verandah or steps.


ROCK PIT To be of hand picked boulders and of cubic capacity approximately double that of the tank. To be connected to the tank by 4"

Agricultural tile. When possible rock pit to be 30 feet distant from Septic Tank.

INSPECTION The Septic Tank, rock pit and all drains to be inspected before being used. The tank, Pit and drains must not be covered until certified as efficient by the Septic Tank Inspector.
