

THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 3248

*Amended by
B/L #3266*

A BY-LAW to authorize the construction of a Four (4') foot Portland cement concrete sidewalk upon the West side of Sixth Street from Fourteenth Avenue south to Thirteenth Avenue, and upon the South side of Fourteenth Avenue from Sixth Street West for a distance of 100 feet, and upon the North side of Thirteenth Avenue from Sixth Street West for a distance of 100 feet, as a local improvement under the provisions of the "Local Improvement Act".

WHEREAS Maurice Whitechurch and others have petitioned the Council to construct, as a local improvement, the work hereinafter described, and the Clerk has certified that the petition is sufficient, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the petition in the manner hereinafter provided.

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

(1) That a Portland cement concrete sidewalk Four (4') feet wide be constructed on the West side of Sixth Street from Fourteenth Avenue south to Thirteenth Avenue, and upon the South side of Fourteenth Avenue from Sixth Street West for a distance of 100 feet, and upon the North side of Thirteenth Avenue from Sixth Street West for a distance of 100 feet, as a local improvement under the provisions of the "Local Improvement Act".

(2) The Engineer of The Corporation do forthwith make such plans, profiles, and specifications and furnish such improvement as may be necessary for the making of a contract for the execution of the work.

(3) The work shall be carried on and executed under the superintendence and according to the directions and orders of such Engineer.

(4) The Reeve and Clerk are authorized to cause a contract for the construction of the work to be made and entered into with some person or persons, firm or corporation, subject to the approval of this Council to be declared by resolution.

(7) The debentures to be issued for the loan to be effected to pay for the cost of the work when completed shall bear interest at four (4%) per centum per annum, and be made payable within two years on the serial plan.

(8) Any person whose lot is specially assessed may commute for a payment in cash the special rates imposed thereon, by paying the portion of the cost of construction assessed upon such lot, without the interest, forthwith after the special assessment roll has been certified by the Clerk.

(9) This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY LOCAL IMPROVEMENT CONSTRUCTION BY-LAW NO. 14, 1952".

DONE AND PASSED in Open Council the Sixth (6th) day of October, A. D. 1952.

RECONSIDERED AND FINALLY PASSED by a three-fourths majority of the Municipal Council on the Twentieth (20th) day of October, A. D. 1952.
